## ADULT DETENTION CENTER CHAPLAIN

In 1995 I began serving full-time in jail and prison ministry and the consistent heartbreak over the last twenty-six years is having inmates make radical commitments to Jesus Christ while they were incarcerated only to have that fruit "*spoil on the vine*" when they were released from custody back into the community. God graciously connected Bishop Gale Williams and the team from Entrusted Connections Ministry with the Prince William Manassas Regional ADC chaplaincy in 2017 and that "*connection*" has become very fruitful.



# God knits ministries, people, and resources together in an intricate web of relationships that elevates each individual connection to its maximum potential.

When vision combines with process and this is supported with God's provision what emerges is a ministry that can be self-sustaining, credible, and transformational. This is what the Entrusted Connections Life House is to the newly released female residents of the Prince William Manassas Regional Adult Detention Center.

#### It is a safe transitional housing and discipleship opportunity that has established seamless spiritual care for the female graduates of the WIND (Women In New Direction) Program in the ADC.

For the first time in these many years of doing jail ministry I am seeing a community-based partnership that is creating a dynamic bridge from incarceration to freedom for our female inmates. Inmates experience genuine security in the healthy and controlled discipleship of the WIND Program in the ADC while they are incarcerated, but few survive in the "jungle" of freedom that offenders experience when they are newly released from custody. *Without a step-down transition back into the community inmates are highly likely to reoffend and then be reincarcerated within a very short period.* 

The ECLH–One has become a shining light of hope that provides legitimate, sustained, and measurable ministry for women who are transitioning from custody back into the community. I am delighted to be a part of the team that is participating in *the renewal and transformation of ONE LIFE AT A TIME* as women are finding joy and hope as residents of ECLH–One. This relationship and partnership are truly a reflection of Colossians 2:19b, "the Head, from whom the whole body, nourished and knit together through its joints and ligaments, grows with a growth that is from God."

When the Body of Christ connects and fulfills its God-given function as a BODY lives are transformed, teams are built and the kingdom of our God and King Jesus advances.

Hi my name is **Kelli King** and I was released from Prince William County jail in 2021 after serving 4 1/2 years. I was part of the **WIND** which stands for *Women in New Direction*, I was the mentor there for two years until the dorm was closed down due to Covid.

The person I remember speaking to was Bishop Gale, after she told about the Life House, she asked me Ms. King do you have a any questions for me? I said I do, Will you keep me safe, with no hesitation she answered yes I will. Thru my addiction I never felt safe and that was my worst fear, to walk out of those doors and be back right where I started from. But Bishop kept her word and to this day she still is my Cheerleader. I was able to get a job the first 2 weeks I was in the house, I paid off all my fines and most im-

portantly I was Baptized and Bishop was there rooting me on. Every important thing us women go thru Bishop Gail is right there to cheer us on. For myself I was so used to others being ashamed of me or not keeping their word and the Life House teaches us the opposite.

We have support that I have never experienced before. I was able to finish school and now I work at George Mason University as a Peer Support for Addiction and Mental Health. I was taught The Love For God, how to forgive and love myself again. The world has become such a harsh place, but I knew once I walked into the Life House after a long day and closed that door behind me I was safe. And to this day, it doesn't matter what day it is or what time it is, when I call Bishop she always answers the phone, and sometimes just hearing her voice lets me know I'm okay, and for me that is the most important thing.

#### **Blessings!**

**H**i everyone. My name is Jen Logan. I have been in the Entrusted Connections Life House for almost Thirty Days, and it has changed my life drastically but in a wonderful, amazing way. Before I came to The Life House I was homeless and in very dire straits. A so-called friend had me living with a man that was not a good person. He was into drugs and sex trafficking. I got very lucky that I was saved from that life but not before I was brutally raped so the man could get his drugs. Unfortunately, I became addicted to drugs so I could stop the pain of the abuse. I was living in different hotels every night constantly afraid of being found. I found a place that assisted homeless people and they linked me to a program that helped survivors of sex trafficking. The program was helping me with hotel rooms, but I

was still very depressed and felt very alone. The program found out about The Life House, and we filled out an application and I was approved. Several obstacles kept coming up that kept stopping me from moving in. My cats needed boarding because the place doesn't allow pets but as soon as I found a place, I caught Covid. I had to wait until I was healed from the virus. By this point the depression and hopelessness was too much for me to bear so I tried to take my own life. I took a bunch of pills and tried to drown myself in the bathtub. God showed up and wouldn't let that happen. By the grace of God, the cord on the stopper got tangled around my toe and I started instinctively kicking as my lungs filled with water. The cord pulled the stopper out and the water started draining. I started coughing and spitting the water out and I was able to get out of the tub. About two days later my Covid test came back negative and I was able to move into the Entrusted Connections Life House. I know now that all those complications were just Satan attacking me because God had an amazing plan and wonders for my life.

At first it was a little hard to adjust to the new life. I heard all the rules, and I was scared to death thinking how in the world would I accomplish all the things that everyone was asking of me. Well God worked fast. I filled out the application for job number one on the first Monday after I moved in. Continue on Page 4.

The GM told me that he would look at my application and let me know if he wanted to interview me. Well, that Wednesday I had my court date for the drug problem I had. The prosecutor and judge dropped two of the charges and gave me a plea bargain for the third. That was another of God's miracles in my life. I ended up with no jail time and probation with conditions. It was so amazing that the judge actually asked the prosecutor why they were willing to give me such a light sentence and have so much mercy. The prosecutor stated that it was because she knew that I wasn't the problem, and I was just trying to feed a habit I had formed due to the trauma. I could not believe that the person whose job it was to put me away was being so merciful to me and I knew that it was only by the grace of God that she had compassion and sympathy for me.

**Entrusted Connections Life House** is having me doing Devotionals every morning and going to Church and Bible Studies again. It helped me reconnect with God and I found that God was just waiting for me to come back home to him. The Monday before court I was able to reconnect with my old church and start going back to the Celebrate Recovery program that I was part of before Covid hit and closed everything. When I walked through those doors I was greeted with a big hug and a huge shout of **WELCOME HOME!** from the Leaders Lauren, Jennifer and Theresa. I was in tears and couldn't stop crying from the overflowing of love that I felt embraced me. I received my blue starter chip. I was a mess and so scared and ashamed of who I had become but they still were not judgmental. I even shared my story with the whole group of strangers and family.

The Monday after court I was a whole new person. I walked into CR glowing with my head held high after the amazing week I had, and everyone noticed the difference in me and to top it all off that morning I had been told that I had the job at Papa John's. I started the next day. I couldn't believe how much God had done for me that first week at The Life House and I couldn't believe that only a week prior I had been ready to end my life. By the end of my second full week at The Life House I had worked only four shifts and the GM called me Monday morning and said that I was being promoted to shift leader since one of his AGM's had quit and he needed to promote a shift leader to AGM.

When I got to work Tuesday ready to train for shift leader my GM told me that he had a meeting with the District Supervisor Amir that morning and Amir told him that he saw the way I was working on Sat and was extremely impressed. He wanted me to be trained as an AGM so I eventually can be a GM. I was promoted again and given a raise. I was ecstatic. I met with Amir during my shift on Thursday the following week and he complimented me on my work. I am now training for Assistant General Manager and learning how to close at night. Another miracle that occurred is that my oldest daughter that hasn't spoken to me since October called me and wanted to reconnect and I had an amazing time with her. My brother and I have a much deeper connection as well.

**Entrusted Connections Life House** has changed my life so much and I have seen blessing after blessing. I have also seen God's power and love so much that I still can't wrap my head around it. Everyone that I have seen has told me how different I look and that I look like a completely different person. They say that I'm glowing and how I have a light about me now. In a matter of two weeks my life has been changed and God has blessed me so much that I can't believe that it's really happening. It's like I'm dreaming, and I don't want to wake up. I'm waiting for someone to pinch me LOL. I'm so glad that we have such an amazing and awesome God. I know that he isn't done yet and I have more blessing in store for me. I thank God every day for Bishop Gayle, Elder Jaquie, Minister Roslyn and everyone involved with the Entrusted Connections Life House. Without their love, kindness and generosity I probably wouldn't even be here today. They gave me my life back and reconnected me with my Heavenly Father. They've helped me restart my journey back to a deep relationship with God. Thank you, Entrusted Connections Life House. I will continue to and remind others to **CELEBRATE THE GOOD**! Hallelujah and Amen. God bless you all. Thank you for letting me share my story.

# ECLH-One Program 2021-2022

Entrusted Connections Ministry, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, continues to provide a safe living environment for the residents of the Entrusted Connections Life House (ECLH). Workshops in life skills, finance, and wellness along with community resources assist them the women with becoming productive members of the community. Despite the challenges presented with COVID, God continued to provide ways to stay connected, using Zoom technologies and conference calls.

Since the conception of this transitional house four years ago, we continue to see God transforming the lives of the women of ECLH, through prayer, fasting, studying the word, consistency, and training in areas of need.

We are grateful to God for Reverend Tarra Taylor and the small group ministry teams of First Mount Zion Baptist Church, Dumfries, Virginia, for their willingness to provide ongoing lessons that align with the Celebrate Recovery Curriculum. Currently, the theme is," *The Journey Continues Step Study*." Each session consists of a lesson focus, principles & steps to follow and the Beatitudes. Zoom meetings are scheduled for these sessions. Thank God for the Unity in the Spirit!

Studying God's word is vital for all of us. The ladies of ECLH participate in the ECM Wednesday night bible study via Zoom and a more intimate study of God's Word, led by Bishop Gale LeGrand Williams on Sunday evenings, using the book, "*Experiencing the Love of God*"from the Women of Faith series.

Amid the COVID pandemic, the women were able to focus on strengthening their finances and credit. Debbie Williams, Yorktown, Virginia, provided individual sessions to address specific financial needs and concerns. In March, Mr. Paul Moses, Richmond, Virginia, presented an interactive financial literacy session, entitled, Getting Up to Get Out, which incorporated vital credit information and tools.

Another series that has been fruitful to the women of ECLH is *the Journey to Forgiveness sessions*. We understand the importance of forgiveness for ourselves and others that have had a negative impact on our lives. We can dress up, earn excellent salaries, accelerate in our employment opportunities, and love God; however, unforgiveness can hold us back from reaching the heights and depths of God's love when we try to suppress our feelings. Thank God for this program, developed and taught by Reverend Dr. Liz Johnson, Manassas, Virginia. We continue to celebrate the completion of this series with ECLH residents. The beautiful pictures in this article highlight Kelli King, as she completed this series.

Entrusted Connections Life House mission is to offer hope, grace, and support for persons seeking new beginnings that are exiting the penal systems and other institutions of correction and restoration. ## "A TRANSTIONAL HOME FOR WOMEN EX-OFFENDERS"

As we begin to put the season of COVID-19 behind us, Entrusted Connections Ministry (ECM) is happy to report that all is well with the Entrusted Connections Life House (ECLH). Despite the challenges of COVID-19, the ECLH stayed opened and three ex-offenders were able to continue to participate in the various ECLH Programs.

One Resident actually started the ECLH Program at the beginning of COVID in March 2020. She successfully participated in the various ECLH Programs which enabled her to reunite with her family after graduating in April 2021. Another Resident entered the ECLH Program in March 2021. The longest resident has been at ECLH since August 2019 and continues to take advantage of the various ECLH Programs.

ECLH has continued to be blessed with new residents. Since last year, ECLH reaccepted one ex-offender and accepted two new ex-offenders. ECLH also expanded its outreach to non-ex-offenders (other women in need of housing) and one has been accepted.

To date, 9 ex-offenders and 1 non-ex-offender have participated in the ECLH Program; 5 have successfully completed the programs and 2 currently remain.

All of the ECLH residents participate in the ECM Morning Proverbs Call, the ECM Wednesday Night Bible Study, Sunday Bible Study with Bishop Gale LeGrand Williams, and various other programs. Hopefully soon, ECM will be able to minister to the Women in New Direction (WIND) at the Prince William County – Manassas Regional Adult Detention Center again. ECM prayerfully anticipates new participants in the ECLH Program from the Wind Dorm and other community organizations. So, as God opens doors, ECM is excited about what God is doing at the ECLH!
