

TESTIMONY FROM TAMI KEHL - ECLH-ONE RESIDENT

My name is Tami and I'm a resident of the Entrusted Connections Life House. I was entangled in a life of drugs and abuse of every kind imaginable. I will never forget the daily battles that I fought because they led me to the opportunity of being blessed by the presence of all the ECM women in my life, but most importantly led me to trust and believe in God's unconditional love for me. I lived with so much pain because of all the hurt that I've endured at the hands of others. That pain led to no self-worth and a decision to drown myself in my addiction and falsely disguise my suffering. I let men control, abuse, and imprison me because I thought that's what I deserved. They became my idol because they showed me attention (even though it was never positive). They made me believe their actions were out of love and that's one emotion that I craved to feel. At one period of time, I was literally fed drugs so I wouldn't have the strength or will-power to get up and leave the situation. In the process, I lost everything, including my relationships with my children down to all my personal belongings. Eventually, I lost my freedom for over two years of my life.

Being incarcerated was one of the most difficult and loneliest times in my life until I decided to sign up for the **W.I.N.D.** (*Women In a New Direction*) dorm and asked God to be a part of my life. That's when I began to have hope and realized I had a purpose in life. Praying and reading God's Word were two simple things that I began to do daily and made the biggest change in who I was. I had faith that God was on my side and came to know that ultimately, being incarcerated saved my life. For once in about 7 years, I wasn't staring death in the eyes. I did not worry about not waking up each morning due to my own actions or under the hands of another. I finally found unconditional love that I yearned for in God. A love that forgave all my sins then washed them away. A love that taught me the power of forgiveness when it came to myself and others. The guilt I always felt is diminishing each and every day. I've got a second chance and the sky's the limit thanks to the Life House and all the support and blessings that I continue to receive every day. Bishop Gale and the other women in the ministry truly care and want me to succeed. I never have to go through anything on my own again. These days I rely on my faith in God and the guidance of these amazing women as I move forward and embrace this new chapter of my life. I am not without battles, but the difference now is that I know I'll make it through them with God by my side and come out of everything with amazing joy in my heart and a newfound love for life. During the 8 months that I've been a resident of the Life House, I have completed Forgiveness-The Journey class, Spiritual Victory in the Midst of the Pandemic Session, Self-Awareness Workshop, Business Smart Entrepreneurial Training Workshops and Celebrate Recovery. I am thankful that these opportunities were placed before me and know that this is just the beginning of wonderful things to come.

Entrusted Connections Life House (ECLH)

In 2020, the ECLH Boutique received large quantities of donated items, volunteer support, and funds used to launder clothing, despite the onset of COVID-19. The boutique carries clothing apparel, accessories, bedding, bath, toiletries, and other donated items that meet the needs of the women staying at the ECM Life House 1.


