## RHODE ISLAND GENERAL LAWS

## "The Law governing disposal of Old Inventory"

Section 34-31-2 of the General Laws in Chapter 34-31 entitled "Launderers' Cleaners'

Sale to enforce lien – If such charge or charges remain unpaid for a period of at least six (6) months any such launderer or cleanser may sell such article at private or public sale or may dispose of such article in any other manner. After said six (6) months period has expired the owner and/or legal possessor of the article shall have no further right, title or interest in and to the said article.

Introduced January 26, 1983.
