

REGULAR BOARD MEETING  
JULY 6, 2011  
CITY HALL, 7:00 p.m.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor James Snook, also present were aldermen Lloyd Bressman and Staley Snook, Charlene Cook and Marshall Welch were not present.

Raylene Perry led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Bressman moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting as read Snook seconded, motion carried with the mayor casting a yes vote to break the tied vote (3-0)

Snook moved to pay the expenditures as presented, Bressman seconded, Motion carried with the mayor casting a yes vote to break the tie (3-0)

The three member board suggested that Spiers advise DNR of the city's decision to use land application instead of improvements to existing sewer to conform to upcoming discharge regulations.

Spiers reported that he is attending classes to renew his certifications. He also reported that we are having problems with the irrigation pump.

Bruner reported a combined total of 125 hours worked, 18 callouts and 7 tickets issued. The call outs included 10 peace disturbances 3 animal reports, 3 reports of illegal parking, 2 requests for information. Bruner also advised that he had been in contact with a group of teenagers frequenting the city park regarding reports of trespassing and vandalism.

Steve Perry reported that a June 27th storm had brought down a large tree blocking Z highway from about 6:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. MODOT was on the scene early but KCP&L did not arrive until 3:00 p.m.

Steve and Raylene Perry were also present to discuss a problem that they have been having with a neighbor regarding parking. Steve Perry has an occasional need to park on Lewis street, where he lives but just up the street from his property line. For 25 years this has not been an issue and he is not impeding the flow of traffic and he is not blocking anybody's driveway. Since the city does not have restrictive parking and doesn't intend to implement such a policy it is ok for him to park there.

The lease for the sports association was tabled until August

Bressman moved to adjourn, Snook seconded, motion carried with the mayor casting the third vote. (3-0)
