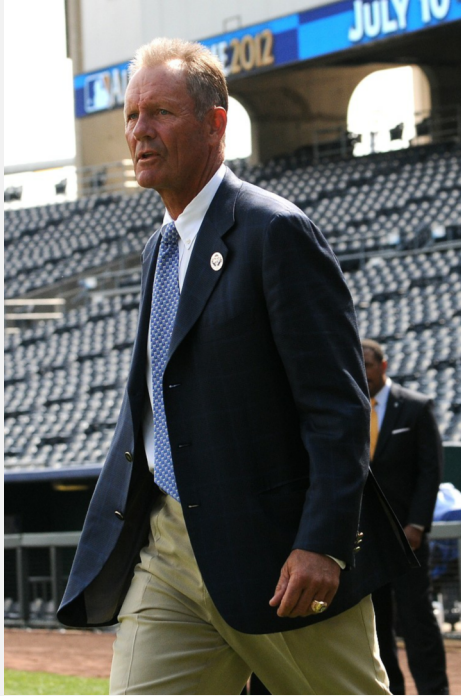

Baseball Hall of Famer George Brett has been named The Native Sons and Daughters of Greater Kansas City 2013 Outstanding Kansas Citian.

Highlights of these efforts:

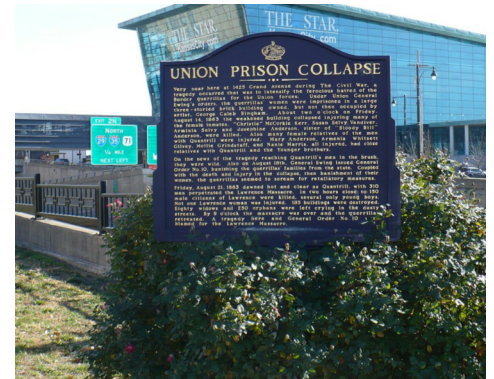
- More than 100 cast metal markers have been placed throughout the Kansas City area to commemorate historic sites.

In 2013 markers are scheduled for the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum and at a site north of Liberty to commemorate the 1837 Platte Purchase.

- Eleven NSDKC Community Service Committees cooperate with area historic organizations to increase public awareness of significant landmarks, museums and cemeteries.

Your support of our 41st annual Outstanding Kansas Citian award will help The Native Sons and Daughters of Greater Kansas City continue this tradition for another 80 years.

- Two Community Service Committees work with The State Historical Society of Missouri to maintain the NSDKC collection of documents related to the history of the Kansas City area.
- For more than 70 years the NSDKC has collaborated with Union Cemetery and Fort Osage to preserve these historic sites.
- The Native Sons and Daughters of Greater Kansas City has been a participant with local and national groups in undertakings to enhance the rich heritage of the Kansas City area. Among these endeavors are the expansion of the National World War One Museum at Liberty Memorial and the Town of Kansas pedestrian bridge and trail markers.



A marker at 14th Street and Grand Boulevard, between the Sprint Center and The Kansas City Star's Press Pavilion, designates a historic site in the midst of urban development. Placing markers to preserve the identity of historic sites in the Kansas City metroplex remains an ongoing goal of The Native Sons and Daughters of Greater Kansas City.
