We are pleased to present this Annual Report of the Cupertino Sanitary District (CuSD), recognizing **60 years** of service to over 23,000 customers within the communities of Cupertino, portions of Saratoga, Sunnyvale, Los Altos and unincorporated areas within Santa Clara County!

CuSD covers approximately 15 square miles, serving a population of over 50,000 people with more than 23,000 residential and business units. The District owns and manages over one million lineal feet of sewer mains, a half million lineal feet of sewer laterals, 17 pump stations, over 4,000 manholes and flushing inlets, and one equipment storage facility. CuSD conveys nearly 5 million gallons of wastewater daily from our customers for treatment at the San Jose/Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility.

CuSD's collection system, much of which is more than 50 years old, has been maintained proactively with regular cleaning and development of a Capital Improvement Program (CIP) aimed at improving efficiency as well as extending its useful service life.

What's New at the District?

- Despite uncertainty with funding the cost required at the San Jose-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility, estimated at \$1.4 billion over the next 10 years, the District maintains a reserve policy to better manage our cash flow.
- In July 2016, Chair Andrews resigned from the CuSD Board of Directors. His decision to retire and live in the High Sierras was his ultimate goal. We wish him well!
- District has implemented XP-SWMM, a computer hydraulic modeling system, to ensure that the District's infrastructure will meet the future growth demand.



2016 Facts & Figures

Notable Accomplishments in 2015-2016:

- Completed four capital improvements projects.
- Implemented ARC-GIS, a computerized geographic information system.
- Completed I/I (inflow/infiltration) Study.
- Serviced and cleaned over 25% of our sewer mains, including aggressive program for CCTV inspection (closed circuit television camera) of our sewer mains.
- Coordinated major developments: Main Street, Rosebowl, Apple Campus, Saich Way, Biltmore, and many others.
- Received the Special District Leadership Foundation District Transparency Certificate of Excellence.
