# TENEBRAE—SERVICE OF SHADOWS MARCH 29, 2024 8:00 p.m.

The service of tenebrae dates back as far as the seventh century and depicts the final events of Christ's life on earth. The word tenebrae comes from the Latin for "darkness" or "shadows." The candles as they are extinguished one by one symbolize the fading loyalty of the disciples and friends of Jesus. In its original form at the conclusion, the final candle, representing Christ, was placed behind the altar leaving the church in darkness. In its amended form, the Christ Candle is returned to the altar, signifying that, even on this day, "nothing can separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord".

# **PRELUDE**

"Jesus Walked This Lonesome Valley"

#### SILENT MEDITATION

Shadows of Holy Week, adapted from the ancient Tenebrae, a word meaning "shadows," originated during the early years of the church. The service depicts the events that led to the crucifixion.

The people, entering silently, should meditate on the fact that it was on Maundy Thursday that the twelve disciples were with Jesus in the upper room for the last time, and that he and they stood in the shadow of the cross.

The extinguishing of the candles and the gradual dimming of the lights as the several portions of the story are ready symbolize the flight of the disciples and the approaching hour of the crucifixion. The moment of total darkness recalls the hours Christ was in the tomb. The return of the light is prophetic of the Easter soon to dawn.

Think and pray on the meaning of this service for you and for the church.

P: The Lord be with you.

<sup>20</sup> When it was evening, he sat at the table with the twelve disciples; <sup>21</sup>and as they were eating, he said, "Truly I tell you, one of you will betray me." <sup>22</sup> And they were very sorrowful, and began to say to him one after another, "Is it I, Lord?" <sup>23</sup> He answered, "He who has dipped his hand in the dish with me, will betray me. <sup>24</sup> The Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed. It would have been better for that man if he had not been born." <sup>25</sup> Judas, who betrayed him, said, "Is it I, Master?" He said to him, "You have said so."

# 2. THE SHADOW OF INNER AGONY

Reading 2 Luke 22:39-44

<sup>39</sup> And when he came to the place he said to them, <sup>40</sup> "Pray that you may not enter into temptation." <sup>41</sup> And he withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and knelt down and prayed, <sup>42</sup> "Father, if thou art willing, remove this cup from me; nevertheless not my will, but thine, be done." <sup>43</sup> And there appeared to him an angel from heaven, strengthening him. <sup>44</sup> And being in agony he prayed more earnestly; and his sweat became like great drops of blood falling down upon the ground.

#### 3. THE SHADOW OF LONELINESS

Reading 3 Matthew 26:40-45

<sup>40</sup> And he came to the disciples and found them sleeping; and he said to Peter, "So, could you not watch with me one hour? <sup>41</sup> Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." <sup>42</sup> Again, for the second time, he went away and prayed, "My Father, if this cannot pass unless I drink it, thy will be done." <sup>43</sup> Again he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were heavy. <sup>44</sup> So leaving them again, he went away and prayed for the third time, saying the same words. <sup>45</sup> Then he came to the disciples and said to them, "Are you still sleeping and taking your rest? Behold, the hour is at hand, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners.

(Silence for meditation; the third candle is extinguished)

Reading 4 Matthew 26:48-50

<sup>48</sup> Now the betrayer had given them a sign, saying, "The one I shall kiss is the man; seize him." <sup>49</sup> And he came up to Jesus at once and said, "Hail, Master!" And he kissed him. <sup>50</sup> Jesus said to him, "Friend, why are you here?"

(Silence for meditation; the fourth candle is extinguished)

# 5. THE SHADOW OF ACCUSATION Reading 5 Mark 15:8-15

<sup>8</sup> And Pilate again said to them, <sup>9</sup> "Then what shall I do with the man whom you call the King of the Jews?" <sup>10</sup> And they cried out again, "Crucify him!" And Pilate said to them, <sup>11</sup> "Why, what evil has he done?" <sup>12</sup> But they shouted all the more, "Crucify him!" <sup>13</sup> So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released for them Barabbas; <sup>14</sup> and having scourged Jesus, <sup>15</sup> he delivered him to be crucified.
