Play Silly Directions with your family.


Let's start by putting your left arm all the way around your back and put your right elbow on your knee. Now walk in a circle quacking like a duck. Who was the silliest?



Did you know that Jesus gave us directions on how we should treat others? See how many of Jesus' directions you can follow.

- When your brother or sister does something bad to you, do something good for them in return.
- When you watch TV with your family, look around the room and take the worst seat, not the best.
- Don't ask someone to get something for you, instead, get up, get it yourself, but don't get it just for yourself ask the rest of your family if you can get them something.
- Instead of trying to be first, try to be last.





Strange Instructions Joshua 5:13 – 6:27

The Israelites just spend 40 years in the wilderness, because of their bad decision not to listen to Joshua and Caleb. Moses has passed away, and Joshua is now their leader.

Joshua is now ready to lead the Israelites into their "Promise Land"; but they need to invade Jericho. The only problem is, is that the city of Jericho has really strong walls all the way around the city. How would they get in? Well, God had a plan.

God told Joshua to have the people march around the city wall for seven days. If you were Joshua, what would you have thought of this plan? How will you convince the people to march a round Jericho for seven days? How would you have explained to the people that they will be able to knock down the wall around Jericho just by walking around it for seven days?

Well, Joshua didn't complain he just did what God told him to do and put his faith in God. Because Joshua believed; the people believe too. The Israelites walked around the city of Jericho for seven days and on the seventh day they walked around the city seven times without saying a word. Then after they finished walking around Jericho for the seventh time the priests blew a long blast on their ram's horns and then all of the Israelites shouted as loud as they could shout.

What do you think happened?

If you guessed that the wall fell down, you are correct. The strong wall around Jericho collapsed and came tumbling down. So the Israelites were able to walk right into the city and they were able to live in the wonderful land God had promised them.

If you were an Israelites and Joshua told you to follow God's directions to walk around the city for seven days what would you have done? Would you have obeyed without complaining?

What can you learn from this lesson?


