## **Did you know Helen Billington...**

Helen Billington proved that not all of the settlers were "Saints" or saints.

Her husband was executed in 1630 for the first murder in the colony.

Then she married Gregory Armstrong. She had various controversies in court and with her son and others. In 1636 she was accused of slander, fined five pounds and "to sit in the stocks and be publicly wipt."

Her grandchildren were "bound out for service" when their parents were convicted of trying to entice the children away from their work and punished by sitting in the stocks. Later her son Francis became more stable in character and served on committees. Apparently, Helen Billington had many troubles and little sympathy in the Plymouth colony.
