#### Faithful Politics in a Divided World

Mark your calendars and join us for a totally different type of live-stream on Monday, February 22nd from 7 - 8:30 PM. This is not exposition of the Word, but rather a challenge to deep thinking and exhortation formed upon Biblical principles. If you've never attended forums at the Upper House in Madison, you are in for a treat.

"Jesus tells his followers to be the "salt of the earth" and the "light of the world" (Mat 5:13-14). But what do these calls mean for Americans in 2021? How do Christians resist both cynicism and triumphalism, preserve their public witness in a democratic society, and work for solutions to complex social problems?

Vincent E. Bacote, Professor of Theology and Director of Wheaton College's Center for Applied Christian Ethics will explore these questions. Drawing on the Reformed tradition, Dr. Bacote will outline a public theology that calls the church to transcend the deep polarization in our world, seek the common good, and pursue justice for all."

You don't need to align with political or doctrinal positions or be a SJW for this time to be profitable. That is the point: Christians don't need to agree on every matter, but we do need to give God glory as we work together. This live-stream explores how to make that a reality. 

# Did you know Donald Mullen...

The Reverend Donald Mullen was a gentle giant in modern

Congregational history. Throughout his long ministry, Don remained active in the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches from 1990 until his death in 2019.

A passionate advocate of the practice of silence, meditation and mindfulness, Don was often found leading prayer and healing services at pastoral spiritual retreats. He was a pastor's pastor, who served numerous Congregational churches; including Pennsylvania, Illinois, Michigan, New York, and Texas.

Don was especially concerned about the issues of mental health and chronic homelessness in Terre Haute, Indiana. He worked with his church and the community to find solutions. As efforts to seek funding for the needed housing grew, Mental Health Partners of America became a partner. He helped begin and complete the construction of many apartment buildings including one created exclusively for military veterans who are chronically homeless and with disabilities.
