## Highlights from Spring and Summer 2020

- ❖ 9 students prayed to receive Christ as savior through on campus outreach and Beach Reach!
- ❖ Over 200 Gospel conversations were had in the Spring semester and that work is continuing into the summer.
- ❖ 50 BCM students were involved in sharing the Gospel, many for the first time.
- ❖ Over 700 meals and \$5,060 dollars in gift cards were given away by our NKBA churches to bless NKU International students who are stuck here for the summer due to travel restrictions. 2 Bible studies for Internationals has grown out of this work!

## Ways to Help

- ❖ Bring on a Campus Ministry Intern (CMI) who will help your church reach the students in your area. We are able to train this intern to be self-funding through ministry partner development.
- ❖ Start a ministry from your church to a local, unengaged campus. The KBC will support you to bring on a Campus Ministry Leader (CML) who will be a staff member for your church and lead your college ministry.
- ❖ Help provide scholarships for students to attend conferences and mission trips.
- ❖ Financial support. This will enable us to continue reaching lost students at NKU and our other local campuses.

Even with the semester screeching to an early halt with Covid, the Lord used BCM students to share the Gospel over 200 times in the Spring. That brings our total number of witnessing encounters for the year above 400 with 15 having prayed for salvation! It was a fantastic year of discipleship and outreach for the BCM as the students truly owned the vision of the BCM at NKU, "To know Christ and to make Him known on our campus."

I am always grateful to the NKBA for believing in reaching college students and supporting us in those efforts. The generosity of our churches has never been in question. However, the outpouring of blessing for NKU International students this summer, in the midst of this time of uncertainty and challenge for our churches, has been lavish like our heavenly Father's love is for us (1 John 3:1)! The Internationals have been so surprised and blessed by the meals and gift cards they have been given and doors for getting the Gospel have opened with many of them consequently. I have many churches to thank. Forgive me if I fail to add your church to this list, it has been hard to keep track because so many have been a part of this ministry! Thank you to Hickory Grove, Highland Heights, Main Street, Fairlane, Piner, Big Bone, Mentor, Cornerstone, Erlanger, Union, Grant's Lick, 1<sup>st</sup> Twelve Mile, Living Church, Karin and the WMU, and Jim, Lori, and the NKBA! This has really been above and beyond and I have been personally blessed by the love you have all shown these students from the nations.

My deepest concern is that, due to all of the restrictions on campus, we may be hindered in getting the Gospel to lost students. We need wisdom on how to reach out in creative and effective ways so that the name of Jesus will continue to be lifted up on our campus.
