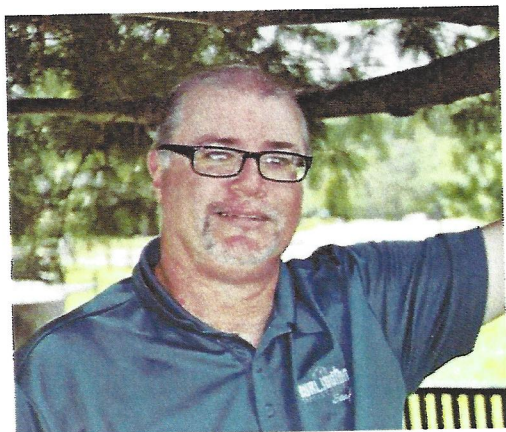

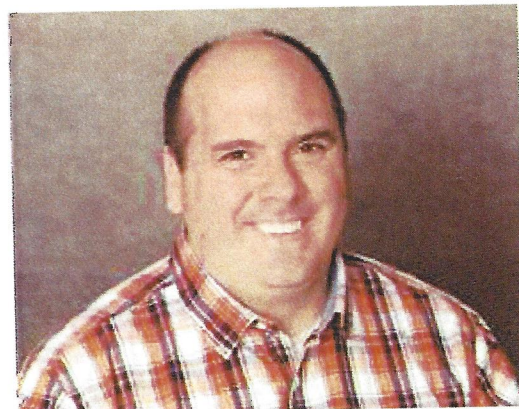

Minutes of "Spring" Executive Board Meeting

May 2, 2022

The Northern Kentucky Baptist Association Executive Boards "Spring" Meeting was held on Monday May 2nd, 2022. at the Christ Baptist Church in Cold Spring.

(Note: The next meeting will be the Fifty-Fifth (55th) "Fall" Annual Meeting to be held on November 7th, 2022. Exact Location is still to be determined.)

Beginning of the Meeting:

Moderator Stuart Chowning (Pastor – Mentor Church) called the meeting to order at 6:30pm.

A period of Worship was led by the Praise Team of Christ Baptist Church.

Pastor Al Weeks (Christ) welcomed everyone. He then led in Scripture and opened the meeting with Prayer.

Agenda for the meeting was presented by the Moderator, with no objections voiced, the agenda was approved, as printed.

Minutes: The Moderator provided an opportunity to review "The Minutes of the 54th annual "Fall" Meeting (from November 1st, 2021), as printed in the Book of Reports. With no objection/corrections noted, the Fifty-Fourth (54th) Annual Meeting Minutes were approved, as printed.

Associational Committee/Organization Reports: The following Reports were presented:

Financial/Stewardship Report: Lori Orne, Associational Treasurer, presented the Treasurer's Report. She highlighted the following Items:

NKBA 2022 Budget vs Actual: The 2022 Budget is \$301,585. Expenditures (to date) are \$10,831 (31.0% of the Budget).

NKBA 2022 Budget Income (by Church, thru 4/30/2022) was \$92,892.59. (Note: The NKBA does not have the Extra Income of the PPP (Payroll Projection Program) Loan, this year). Budget Income, to date, is currently \$399 short of 2022 Budget Requirements.

She advised that the NKBA churches have been "exceedingly generous" in the past year, In addition to Budget Income, Churches contributed over \$100,000 to the Western Kentucky Tornado Disaster Relief efforts.

She also highlighted the NKBA Insurance Line Item. In the past, this item has been exclusively Building and Liability Insurance, but now includes vehicles that the NKBA has for Mission and Ministry purposes. Currently this additional expense is being charged, against this line-item, but possibly could more accurately recorded elsewhere. The Finance Committee will address this, at their next meeting, to be reflected in the 2023 Budget Proposal.

Thank You to all churches who support the NKBA so faithfully. Your generosity and spirit of service is "appreciated."

Baptist Campus Ministry: Josh Skipper (Regional Campus Minister) presented his report. He highlighted the following:

Highlights from Spring 2022:

Four (4) students made a profession of faith.

Took Fifty-Four (54) on the Spring Break spiritual retreat.

NKBA Churches served 31 meals to NKU Students.

Thomas More University and Gateway (Florence Campus) are schools we are currently wanting to start Ministries.

Other Associational Reports: Other Associational Committees/Organizations Reports were presented. These included, but were not limited to the following:

WMU: Karin Edgington (NKBA WMU Director) presented her report. She highlighted the following:

NKBA WMU continues to support the following ministries with time, money and prayer: Turfway Park, BCM at NKU, Moore Activity Center, Disaster Relief and The Seasons & Baptist Village.

Eliza Broadus Offering (2022 Goal, \$1,250.000) Ministry allocations awarded to NKBA in 2022. Hope Ministry, Covington First - \$1,000; Moore Activity Center - \$4,000; NKBA Associational Missions - \$500.

MAC Center: Karin Edgington, in the absence of Amy Wilhelmus (MAC Director), referred Executive Board Members to Amy's Written Report. (Pages 9 & 10 in the Book of Reports).

Motion by David Wiggins (Pastor – Walton), seconded by Bill Bates, to accept all reports. With no objections voiced, the Motion was carried.

New Business: The following item(s) of New Business was presented:

Property Agreement: The following Information on a Property Agreement between the NKBA and The Living Church, Inc was presented: Copy Attached.

“The NKBA without expectation of compensation does hereby give free of sale, to The Living Church, INC, to be used for it’s purposes in the sole and exclusive discretion, the following described property:

Grace Baptist Church located at 5226 and 5228 Madison Pike in Independence KY 41051 (this includes the parsonage at 5226 Madison Pike, Independence KY 41051.”

Regarding the motion, the following information was presented:

- 1) Within Thirty-Six (36) months, should Living Church decide to vacate the property, the property will revert to the NKBA for the use of another Baptist Church/Ministry.
- 2) After the first (1st) Thirty-Six (36) months of occupancy, Should Living Church decide to sell the property, or any part thereof, Living Church will give no less that 10% received from the sale to the NKBA.
- 3) Grace Baptist Church has closed.

Following a period of discussion, the Motion by Mark Webb (Union), second by Kyle Marlette (2nd Twelve Mile) to accept the agreement was approved.

Director of Missions: Dan Francis (Pastor – Latonia) presented the final report from Jim Woolums, as NKBA DOM. (Note: DOM Woolums submitted his resignation on November 1st, 2021, at the conclusion of the NKBA’S 54th Annual Meeting).

As requested in his report, DOM Woolums asked the NKBA to “allow him to remain in the condo owned by the NKBA, through the end of the year.” The NKBA will have **No Cost** since he has paid the monthly fees and utilities since moving in. It can be immediately returned to BLC at any time, and the “Association will have resources to continue its ministry in the future.”

Motion by Tim Freimuth (Bethesda), Seconded by Dan Francis (Latonia) to approve this request. Motion carried.

Closing:

The Moderator entertained a Motion to Adjourn, (Numerous Seconds). With no objections voiced, the Motion was carried.

Following a closing Prayer, by the Moderator, The Meeting was adjourned at 7:35pm.

Prerequisite. This gift of property is under the conditions that:

1. In the event The Living Church, Inc. decides to vacate the property within 36 months from the date of transfer listed above, the property described above will revert to the Northern Kentucky Baptist Association for the use of another Baptist Church/Ministry.
2. After the first 36 months of occupancy beginning per the date listed above, in the event The Living Church, Inc. decides to sell the property or any part thereof, The Living Church, Inc. will give no less than 10% received from the sale to the Northern Kentucky Baptist Association.

August 27,2022

The purpose of the meeting was to meet and vote on the Associational Mission Strategist candidate, Dr. Charles Frazier. Dr. Frazier was introduced to the board members present by Stuart Chowning, NKBA Moderator and Chair of the Search Committee.

Dr. Frazier gave an overview of his background and experience in the Southern Baptist Convention and the Kentucky Baptist Convention. His resume was distributed to those present for review, and the floor was opened for questions.

The board asked a variety of questions regarding Dr. Frazier's views on the place of the association, convention, and individual churches within the SBC. Dr. Frazier stressed that church autonomy is our foundation, and that the SBC is a "church up, not top down" organization.

The business portion of the meeting was called to order by the Stuart Chowning, Moderator. The question presented was whether to accept the nomination of the search committee to elect Dr. Charles Frazier as the Associational Mission Strategist for the NKBA. Being a quorum present, ballots were passed for voting. Dr. Charles Frazier was unanimously called as the NKBA AMS. There was applause and thanks to the search committee for their diligent work.

David Wiggins, Walton FBC, moved to adjourn the meeting. Dan Francis, Latonia, seconded. The meeting was closed in prayer.

Highlights from Fall 2022

- ❖ 4 students decided to follow Jesus this semester!
- ❖ We have witnessed to over 200 students.
- ❖ We took 67 to Converge Conference at Camp Cedarmore with 600 KY students attending in total!
- ❖ 40 NKU student going to Connect International Conference. Over 70 internationals at NKU have heard the Gospel through our Story Saturday ministry this semester and one has been saved!
- ❖ New ministry work starting at Thomas More University in partnership with Christ Baptist. Hebron Baptist is continuing their work at Gateway College's Edgewood campus.

Ways to Help

- ❖ Start a ministry from your church to a local, unengaged campus. The KBC will support you to bring on a Campus Ministry Leader (CML) who will be a staff member for your church and lead your college ministry. Thomas More and the Florence campus of Gateway are the schools we are currently wanting to start work on.
- ❖ Bring on a Campus Ministry Intern (CMI) who will help your church reach the students in your area. We are able to train this intern to be self-funding through ministry partner development.
- ❖ Help provide scholarships for students to attend conferences and mission trips.
- ❖ Additional financial support. This will enable us to continue reaching lost students at NKU and other local campuses.

I am in Cave City as I write this in preparation for the KBC Connect International Conference. This event is part of a 50+ year partnership with WMU designed to reach internationals with the Gospel. We have a great group here from NKU this year and the majority of those internationals with us have already had at least one Gospel appointment with one of our staff or students. We hope this weekend will be the time many of them believe on the Lord Jesus and follow Him.

It has been a fruitful semester for us. Our discipleship vision is bearing fruit and by the end of 2022 we will have 30 students who will have either experienced a 3 month discipleship relationship or are currently in one. Those students are then tasked with making disciples themselves and many of them already are. We are taking the time to intentionally and personally teach these young believers to make disciples of all nations as we show them how to obey all Jesus has commanded. Investing in these students is encouraging them to have boldness to share the Gospel. One example of this is how Emma, one of our leaders who is being discipled, witnessed to a student at one of our Gospel survey events. The girl she witnessed to, Rose, wanted to know more about following Jesus and so Emma was ready to help Rose by beginning to disciple her. Pray that Rose will become a disciple-maker as well!

The NKBA Disciple Now youth event is making it's return on February 24th-25th at Burlington Baptist. We are anticipating this being our biggest Dnow yet with 13 churches already committed to being a part of the event. Please reach out to me for information on how your youth can be involved in this "better together endeavor"!

*Jesus Birthday Party – Saturday, December 3rd from 10am-12noon

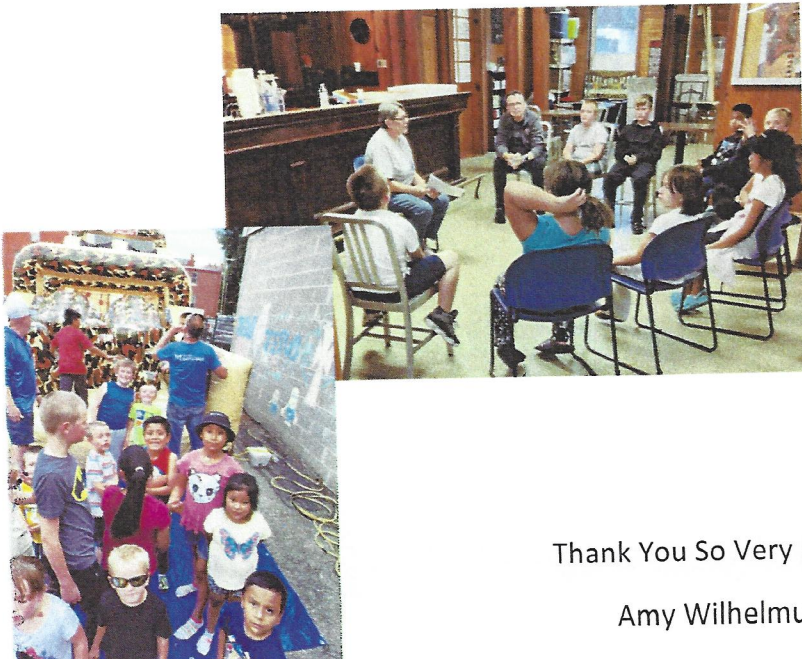
Need people to help with one-on-one evangelism with children and youth.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I - NAME AND PURPOSE

- SECTION 1. This body shall be known as the Northern Kentucky Baptist Association.
- SECTION 2. The objective of this Association shall be the proclamation of the Gospel, cooperative Christian service, and mutual edification of the member churches.

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP AND PRIVILEGES

- SECTION 1. This Association shall be composed of such Baptist churches as may enter into its Constitution and other Baptist churches that may hereafter be elected to its membership according to the regulation of this body.
- SECTION 2. Representation of the body shall be on the following basis of church membership: two (2) messengers for each church and one (1) additional messenger for every fifty (50) members or fractional part thereof, said messengers to be selected from the membership of the respective congregations and not to exceed ten (10) messengers for any one (1) church.
- SECTION 3. Any church desiring membership in this Association shall petition the Executive Board before any regular board meeting, by letter, furnishing satisfactory evidence of sound doctrine and orderly practice and declaring her intention to cooperate with this Body. The Credentials Committee shall make a recommendation about the petition at any regular meeting/Executive Board, providing the Committee determines that amiable relations exist between the petitioning church and the other churches within the Association. When a petition for membership has received approval by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the messengers present at any regular meeting/Executive Board of the Association, the Moderator shall declare the church and her messengers seated.
- SECTION 4. Any church desiring membership into this Association where amiable relations do not exist between the petitioning church and any other church within the Association, action on their petition shall be delayed one (1) year from the forthcoming Annual Meeting. Amiable relations shall include one or more of the following: (1) members of the petitioning church shall have received, at the time of organization, letters as members in good standing from sister Baptist churches; (2) the petitioning Church shall be recommended to the Association by a letter from sponsoring church(es) of the Association. Following this waiting period and when a petition for membership has received approval by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the messengers present at an Annual Session of the Association, the Moderator shall declare the church received and her messengers seated.
- SECTION 5. The Association has no authority over any church, but it may judge of the propriety of retaining in its union any church which has become unscriptural in her doctrine or disorderly in her practice and may withdraw fellowship by a three-fourths (3/4) majority vote of the messengers present at an Annual Session. The Association affirms that the ordination by a church of an avowed homosexual to the deaconate or the gospel ministry constitutes an unscriptural doctrine and a disorderly practice. Any church that ordains an avowed homosexual to the deaconate or the gospel ministry shall be interviewed by the Credentials Committee as soon as possible. If the church refuses to interview with the Credentials Committee, recant its position and rescind ordination of the avowed homosexual, then the Credentials Committee shall move at the next Annual Session that

all messengers from the church in question not be seated and the church be forthwith dismissed from fellowship of the Association.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS AND MEETINGS

- SECTION 1. The body shall meet annually according to the adjournment, but in case of an emergency, the moderator shall call a special session upon the advice and consent of the Executive Board to be held no less than thirty (30) days from the date of the Moderator's call.
- SECTION 2. On the occasion of its Annual Meeting, the body shall hear a report from the Nominating committee to elect a Moderator-elect, Clerk, Treasurer and a parliamentarian. Officers elected to serve for the Associational year shall assume their duties at the close of the Annual Meeting at which they are elected. The Moderator shall not be eligible to succeed himself. Nominations for any office may be received from the floor.
- SECTION 3. These officers shall perform all duties customary to their titles. The head of each department of work shall make a written report to the Association convened in Annual Session and shall make regular reports to the Executive Board between Sessions.
- SECTION 4. The Moderator-elect shall recommend two (2) individuals to the Executive Board to serve on the Nominating Committee, which shall consist of six (6) members in addition to the Moderator and Moderator-elect, who shall serve as voting ex-officio members. The Moderator-elect shall also recommend a committee chair, other than himself. Upon approval by the Executive Board said Nominees shall be presented to the Association in Annual Session for final election. This committee shall recommend to the Association nominees for all officers (except Moderator-elect), Program Directors, Committee Members, and Endowment Fund, Inc. The Nominating Committee will also recommend replacements to the Kentucky Baptist Convention Executive Board as vacancies occur. Each member shall serve until discharged and shall have a charge of all matters pertaining to its respective responsibility.
- SECTION 5. The Nominating Committee shall recommend to the Executive Board at its Spring Meeting, a slate of Associational program leaders and chairpersons who will serve on the Associational Council. These persons shall assume their duties at the close of the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE IV - EXECUTIVE BOARD

- SECTION 1. The Executive Board shall be composed of the Officers of the Association, the pastors of member churches, and two (2) members of each church elected by that church.
- SECTION 2. The Executive Board shall transact the business of the Association during the interim between Sessions, shall report the status of the Association to the member churches during the interim, and shall be authorized to fill any vacancies that may occur during the interim. The elected officers of the Northern Kentucky Baptist Association shall serve as Trustees. The Director of Missions shall serve as Registered Agent for the Northern Kentucky Baptist Association, Inc.
- SECTION 3. The Officers of the Association shall serve as Officers of the Executive Board.
- SECTION 4. Representative of one-fourth (1/4) of the member churches shall constitute a quorum of the Executive Board. The Board shall meet regularly to conduct the business of the Association.

ARTICLE V - ANNUAL LETTERS AND REPORTS

- SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of each member church to report her condition annually by letter to the Association by no later than July 30th of each year.
- SECTION 2. The Associational financial year shall extend from October 1 - September 30 and the budget shall be adopted at the July Board Meeting.

ARTICLE VI - FINANCE

- SECTION 1. The Association shall have power to raise funds by voluntary contribution for carrying out its purposes, to send messengers to any assembly with which it may desire to communicate, and to inquire why any church fails to represent itself in the Association.
- SECTION 2. Expenses incidental to the work of the Offices of the Association and any expense approved by the Association or its Executive Board shall be borne by the Association.

ARTICLE VII - AMENDMENTS

- SECTION 1. This Constitution may be altered or amended by consent of two-thirds (2/3) of the messengers present at any regular meeting/Executive Board, with thirty days written notice having been given to the member churches of the proposed changes (both in writing and/or digital format (email, etc...)). Proposed changes will also appear on the NKBA website and its Facebook site.

- SECTION 2. This body shall be governed by ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER most current revision.

BY-LAWS

1. All sessions of this body shall be opened and closed with prayer.
2. A majority of all churches enrolled in the Association shall constitute a quorum at the Annual Meeting.
3. Persons invited to meet with the Association may be given the privilege to speak but not the right to vote.
4. Every subject presented for the consideration and action of the Association must be introduced by a motion from one messenger, in writing if so requested by an officer or messenger, and seconded by another, and no question shall be debated or voted by the body without such motion and second.
5. No messenger shall speak more than twice to any motion on the same day without permission by majority vote of the messengers present.
6. When the Moderator shall desire to be heard in debate or to be temporarily absent, the chair may be taken by the Moderator-elect or someone approved by the majority voice of the body.
7. Standing committees shall consist of three members or more, elected to serve a three-year term and shall not be eligible for re-election until having been out of office at least one year. The Audit Committee shall be an exception to this by-law allowing for members to serve two (2) consecutive three (3) year terms.
8. The foregoing by-laws may be altered or amended at the Annual Meeting of the Association by vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the messengers present.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

In forming an Association there is necessity for, and the very act purposes, harmony of sentiment in every church composing the society thereof, in order to unite in such a manner as will be likely to keep the unity of the spirit in the bonds of peace. As there are various construction put on the Scriptures, we think it proper to state our views and understanding of the doctrine of grace and salvation as revealed in the Holy Scriptures in the Article of Faith as expressed as follows:

- ARTICLE I There is but one true God, and in the Godhead there are three persons - The Father, the Word (or Son), and the Holy Spirit - and these three are one equal in power, dignity and eternity.
(Matthew 28:19; John 1:1-18; John 14:16-17, 25-26; I Corinthians 8:4-5)
- ARTICLE II The Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the written word of God and the only unerring rule of faith and practice. (II Timothy 3:15,17; II Peter 1:19-21)
- ARTICLE III The sin of Adam brought death, condemnation and moral depravity on all mankind.
(Romans 5:12, I Corinthians 15:22)
- ARTICLE IV Regeneration, sanctification, and justification are only by virtue of the birth, life, death, resurrection, ascension and mediation of Jesus Christ.
(John 3:16; Romans 5:6-11; I Corinthians 6:11)
- ARTICLE V Salvation from sin is the free gift of God through faith in Jesus Christ the Lord.
(Romans 3:23-24; Ephesians 2:8-10)
- ARTICLE VI Immersion only is baptism and none have a right to that ordinance but believers upon giving evidence of faith, and they have a right to partake of the Lord's Supper.
(Matthew 3:13-17; Matthew 29:19-20; Acts 8:35-39)
- ARTICLE VII There will be resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust, and the happiness of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal.
(Matthew 25:31-46; Acts 17:31; I Corinthians 15:12-28)
- ARTICLE VIII The Holy Spirit is necessary to convince men of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment and the Scriptures alone are not sufficient.
(John 16:8-11; Romans 2:9-13)
- ARTICLE IX It is our duty to be engaged jointly and severally for the honor of the Christian faith in holy living through love.
(Matthew 28:19-20; II Corinthians 5:17-20; I John 3:14-18)
