### Jim's Journal

As we begin a NEW YEAR, my NUMBER ONE PRIORITY is engaging more people in the NKBA in PRAYER. I credit Dr. Carolyn Moore for the following story:



"Professor Mark Buchanan visited the famous Tuesday night prayer meeting at Brooklyn Tabernacle in New York. Thousands of people have been gathering there every Tuesday night for years. Buchanan calls it "3,500 God-hungry people storming heaven for two hours." He had dinner with Pastor Jim Cymbala. "In the course of the meal, Jim turned to me and said, 'Mark, do you know what the number one sin of the church in America is? It's not that the divorce rate in the church is roughly the same as society at large... it's not the plague of narcotics or Internet pornography. The number one sin of the church in America,' he said, 'is that its pastors and leaders are not on their knees crying out to God, "Bring us the lost...drug-addicted...the prostitutes...the destitute, bring us the people nobody else wants, whom only you can heal, and let us love them in your name until they are whole."

Mark Buchanan said that in the face of such a statement he had no response <u>because he'd never prayed like that.</u> So that night, he went home, repented, and began to cry out for those nobody wants.

There is no shortage of those people; the fields are full of them, Jesus says. There are fields full of people who desperately need someone who will claim the power of Christ over their broken lives, fields full of people whose salvation story has not yet been told. There are people still out there — in our Jerusalem — who haven't been reached, who more than anything need a fair account of the gospel and a generous dose of grace. And we have lost touch with our heart for them because we have forgotten who we are and the mission Christ has entrusted to us!

It is time for American Christians to remember the Spirit we have and our call to the Harvest. It is time to cry out, to get on our knees and cry out for a neighbor or co-worker, for a brother or son-in-law ... or I don't know ... maybe for your own soul. It is time to cry out for the people we tend to judge most and to seek God's heart for them. It is time for us to set down our unrighteous judgment and begin crying out for the ones Jesus came to save."

Friends, it is time for us as a people to get together and PRAY. FIRST, I am calling on pastors and churches to begin with any warriors who will stand with them to meet weekly for praying specifically for the LOST.

SECOND, I am challenging each church/pastor to engage in B.L.E.S.S. Every Home. This online element will provide the names of your neighbors (I pray for 200 in my Jerusalem by name), five persons each day to pray for will be sent to your personal email and you can track engagement. THIRD, beginning January 27 we will begin 40 Days of Prayer leading up to our Spiritual Awakening Conference March 8-9 at Main Street Baptist Church in Alexandria at 7 PM. You can also go to our Facebook page, Praying for NKY and get a daily devotional to guide you through this process. We also have printed copies per your request at the NKBA office as well as other resources to help enhance this 40 days campaign of prayer.

LISTEN TO THE HURTS of the LOST ENGAGE directly (invite neighbors for a meal, have coffee)

SERVE SACRIFICIALLY (find a way to serve to meet needs)

SHARE YOUR STORY (TELL HOW CHRIST HAS CHANGED YOUR LIFE!)

I'm believing God for the greatest year of harvest we have seen in NKY in decades! The challenge to baptize 10,000 people over the next 10 years (#10K4NKBA) has been released. Each church has been provided with a projected goal to help the NKBA reach this overall goal.

It is my great joy to serve alongside you in the harvest.
