As I close this chapter, I am glad to see the NKBA coming out of the COVID era and beginning to move into mission. I am THRILLED that AI Weeks is leading the first of many teams to travel to Alaska. I am excited that my home church and my pastor, our State Baptist President, Dr. Harold Best is leading teams to do work each month in Western Kentucky. Our local missions continue to thrive at NKU with Josh Skipper, the MAC with Amy Wilhellmus, the Cornerstone Fellowship and Mike Rowe, the HOPE ministry with Adam Crews, and all our multi-ethnic church planters with Chinese, Korean, Burmese, Hispanic, African Immigrants, Deaf, and soon to be launched an Arabic church!

I know the GREATEST days are ahead for the NKBA and I am certain that our search team will bring a great candidate forward who will take the NKBA to an even greater, God-glorifying future.

The past few years have been very difficult personally. I have had mental health battles with depression and anxiety, COVID, and very personal family struggles. In recent days the rumor mill has turned its attention to me and my family. While this is entirely personal, I will tell you that these struggles have impacted my marriage and family. We have all been seeking to find healing and wholeness, but we have not found an end at this point. It was for this reason, that I felt that the best thing for me to do was to continue to work on these personal and family struggles and leave my work with the NKBA. I shared my struggles with the Personnel team and to some close friends. While there is a separation, I will always hold out hope that healing can and will take place. We have not divorced, but it is possible that this could be the result, but that has not yet been written. Without going into any further detail, I hope this will be sufficient for everyone's curiosity and who "NEED TO KNOW!" Well, now you do.

I am pursuing a next chapter to work and serve Christ in the world of business and education. I hope to be able to be a witness there working with people who overwhelmingly are lost and far from God. My hope is to remain in NKY. I ask the NKBA to allow me to remain in the condo owned by the Association through the end of the year. The NKBA will have NO COST as I have paid the monthly fees and utilities since moving in. This is an asset that was procured during my tenure and has an immediate value of around \$140,000 or more to the NKBA. It can be immediately returned to Baptist Life Communities at any time and the Association will have resources to continue it's ministry in the future. This will be true of other churches that may close in future years due to legacy plans drawn up with local churches.

I am grateful to have been your Lead Follower. I have sought to work diligently to focus our attention on our mission locally and particularly a lost world whose ONLY HOPE IS JESUS.
