Jim's Journal

Our Southern Baptist Convention is in a difficult place. The reality of statistical decline in our churches is not debatable. The culture of evangelism that was formerly so deeply rooted in its entities and churches is fading in a notable way. In the past two weeks, Dr. Kevin Ezell, President of the North American Mission Board (NAMB) appointed an Executive Director of a new Evangelism and Leadership group among Southern Baptist Churches, to provide evangelistic resources and equip pastors to help their congregations become more active. Jim Law, who currently serves as the Executive Pastor at First Baptist Church, Woodstock (Atlanta) where Dr. Johnny Hunt is the Lead Pastor, will serve in this role. Woodstock is one of the leading churches in the Southern Baptist Convention. Following that, Dr. Hunt himself was named the Vice President for this new area! These are steps in the right direction. We are looking at 16 years of decline currently and unless there are some major changes, Southern Baptists will be the "new Methodists" (who have been losing members now for 50 years, I left that denomination 30+ years ago because they had lost their first love and I did not fit doctrinally).

"Without our culture being changed in our denomination and our churches, our future can be summed up in one word- SMALLER." These are the words of Dr. Chuck Kelley, President of New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary and the featured speaker at the fall meeting of the NKBA, which takes place on November 5 at Piner Baptist Church in Morning View, KY. (Afternoon session begins at 3:00PM, dinner 5:30PM, evening session at 7:00 PM)

Dr. Kelley says that Southern Baptist Churches need a rebirth of "DISCIPLEISM", a passionate emphasis on BOTH evangelism and discipleship, intricately woven together as intended by our Savior and the Scriptures. The Gospel must be both illustrated and explained. Put more succinctly, "More Southern Baptists must look and live like Jesus, being a distinctive, notable presence as they live and work in their communities." This is FOUNDATIONAL for improving our evangelistic impact in NKY. We do not become more effective in reaching our neighbors by becoming more and more like then. WE WIN THE ATTENTION AND HEARING OF OUR NEIGHBORS BY BEING NOTABLE IN OUR RESEMBLANCE TO CHRIST!" Restoring and cultivating the perception of Christlikeness in the eyes of the community is a key to being able to tell the community about the Gospel.

If a church is going to be effective in evangelism, the church members must take the Gospel outside the walls of the church building. Gospel conversations are opportunities to introduce Jesus into life encounters. These conversations occur at work, in school, during hobbies, and many other settings. The only requirements for a gospel conversation is to start talking to make a connection with a person and then to keep talking until you have an opportunity to say a good word about Jesus. Once the conversation gets to Jesus, seek to explain how He has changed your life and how through repentance your friends can have a relationship with Him.

There are other areas in which we must increase our intensity and I will be writing about them in the coming months. The next Association wide training will occur October 11 at the NKBA office from 5PM-8:30PM with Andy McDonald, from our Kentucky Baptist Convention Evangelism team (which is doing a PHENOME-NAL job in our state). Andy will lead in the training of one of the BEST kits/tools I have ever seen. It's called REACHKY. It is simple and leverages everyone's unique strength in a gospel conversation...THEIR STORY! Just a simple word on what your life was like before Christ, how Christ changed your life, and how He continues to lead you as you follow Him. Mark this on your calendar. I'd love to see EVERY church in the NKBA have at least 2 leaders trained to go back and teach this in every church! It's simple...there is no cost involved (financially) and it is POWERFUL! The power to change the world belongs to storytellers and we have the greatest story of all to tell!

Join with me in praying for Spiritual Awakening for our Pastors, leaders, churches, and our Southern Baptist Convention. Mark the October training down and plan to attend our fall meeting with Dr. Chuck Kelly on November 5. I'm expecting God to do great things. Will you agree with me and support this effort by your prayers and attendance?

It is a blessing to serve Christ and the churches of the NKBA!


