CENTER ON THE CROSS

Dear Servants of Christ,

The cross of Christ stands at the center of our observance of the Lenten season. We remember what our Savior did for us by dying in our place to save us from sin and death forever. As part of our focus during these 40 days that lead to Good Friday, then, is making the cross something that truly does have a bearing on our day-to-day living. Here are some was to look to the cross this Lent and be renewed in your walk of faith



Center on the cross as a **reminder**. The cross reminds us that we are sinners who need to confess our sins and receive forgiveness in Jesus.

Center on the cross as a **guide**. Daily we are faced with decisions about what to do in our lives. The cross guides us to follow God's will in our words and deeds, as Jesus did.





Center on the cross as a **comfort**. On the cross Jesus announced to the repentant thief, "Today you will be with me in paradise." Those words of comfort wash over us as well when we look to the cross and recall that it opens up the door of heaven to us.

Center on the cross as a **motivator**. In times of weakness and struggle, the cross stirs us to continue on, as Christ did, and draw on the power of God to stay committed to Christ and share the Good News of salvation found on in Him who died in weakness but rose in might.

Creating Unity Through Living Water

Because the Church is called to be God's primary agent for transformation in the world, we intentionally focus our Living Water ministry on collaborating with, and building up, the local church. Working with the local fellowship of believers promotes the long-term success of our work by allowing us to address emotional, relational, and spiritual needs along with the physical ones.

In 2019, Water Mission brought together pastors from different denominations in Honduras to organize and execute safe water and sanitation initiatives. In Malawi, we partnered with Ruth's Shawl to train 170 pastors, local leaders, and community members on Biblical principles. In Peru, safe water commissioning ceremonies became venues for interdenominational cooperation—events where various churches presented songs, dances, skits, and prayers.

Our mission to end the global water crisis is an undertaking we know is enormous and incredibly urgent. Through collaborations with likeminded partners like you, we believe we can bring safe water to the <u>2.1 billion</u> people around the world that currently lack access.
