

# Moffat County Fair Honorary Volunteers Keith and Shelley Pankey

The Moffat County Fair board has selected Keith & Shelley Pankey as the 2022 Fair “Volunteers of the year”. Keith & Shelley have not only donated countless hours helping at the Moffat County Fair but they are also involved in numerous other entities that help at the fair. They say, “it is for the kids & the community.” They enjoy going to the fair each year to see everyone & watch the kids grow & bring back families of their own to the fair. Keith says that “there are no better people than Ag people!”

Keith & Shelley are both 4<sup>th</sup> generation ranchers in the Yampa Valley. Shelley was from Meeker CO, but when her family moved to Axial basin, she started attending school in Moffat County in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade and has lived here ever since. The Pankey family has been in Moffat County since homesteading here in 1917 on Great divide. Keith & Shelley met in High School & were married on August 12<sup>th</sup>. 1972. Friends & Family did not need to worry about an Anniversary party, because it was always during the fair, and they were always all there together!

Neither Keith nor Shelley attended more than 1 year competing in 4-H as children because their families lived too far out of town, but they were very involved in FFA and Ranching growing up. Their boys, Kevin & Justin, however, started 4-H at a young age showing steers.

Along with full-time jobs, Keith & Shelley have been volunteering at the Fair for a very long time. When ask to help, they jump right in. Keith & Shelley were asked to help pick the Fair Queens back when DeLaine Brown was the Extension Agent, and have been involved with interviewing the Queens & helping with the program ever since. Keith (with Shelley’s help) has been involved in and part of the Moffat County Cattlemen, Fair Board, Beef Superintendent, and Foundation for over 30 years. They are both a staple in beef weigh-ins every year helping. They say it is always entertaining watching new steers, and new exhibitors coming in with their steers for the first time but also rewarding watching the kids grow and learn each year.

As well as being selected for Volunteer of the year, Keith & Shelley have received numerous awards through the years for Land Conservation, Range Management, and the most recent being the “2022 Colorado Leopold Conservation Award” for their commitment to traditional agriculture while working to implement daily conservation practices on their land east of Town. Keith has also been awarded the “Super Superintendent award” from the fair in 1999 and they had the Fair dedicated to them in 2008. They say “It is not for the awards, they do it for the kids”. They are proud to be part of the Fair & have enjoyed seeing all the improvements made through the years.
