The Pulpit and Pen

Discipleship: Art or Science?

Any mature Christian would agree that discipleship is an integral part of being a Christian. Nowhere in the Bible are we commanded to evangelize. The Great Commission commands us to make disciples. While evangelism is an integral part of that, it is not enough merely to lead someone to Christ. God expects us to disciple everyone we lead to faith in Jesus.

However, the question remains whether discipleship is a hit-or-miss endeavor. Is leading someone into a closer relationship with Christ an art that some are just better at doing, or is discipleship a science that can be learned? The answer is both.

To the degree that teaching and discipleship is an art, the apostle Paul listed teaching as a spiritual gift (Romans 12:7). The Holy Spirit gifts and calls some as teachers to equip and disciple the church (1 Corinthians 12:28 and Ephesians 4:11-12). We have no control over whom the Holy Spirit calls to a teaching ministry. That is entirely God's decision.

However, for those who have been called to that ministry, there is also a science to the process. We can learn to be better teachers. If God has called us to that ministry, we have a moral obligation to improve our ability to utilize the gift that

God has given us.

There are three basic methods by which a person learns, and there are three levels of learning. (I do not believe it is a mere coincidence that God created us to learn this way. It would appear that even our minds are designed to reflect the Trinity.) The three ways we learn are by hearing, seeing, and doing. The three levels of learning are mental, emotional, and functional.

Educators refer to the three methods of learning as *auditory* (hearing), *visual* (seeing), and *kinesthetic* (functional). Some people learn better utilizing one of these methods over the others. Some learn via a combination of two or all three methods. For example, some people can memorize a passage of scripture simply by hearing it. Others need to see it and read it. Yet others may need to practice it.

Jesus was a master teacher and used all three methods with His disciples. He would preach to them and teach them. He would show them by example. Then He would send them out to practice and get experience. Our Creator understands how we learn because He designed us.

There are also three levels of learning with which God created us. We can remember mere facts (mental). We can develop an

appreciation or love for an idea (emotional). We can replicate a fact or idea in our lives so that we incorporate the concept into the things that we do (functional).

These three levels of learning are called *cognitive* (mental), *affective* (emotional), and *psychomotor* (functional). Cognitive learning is the ability to remember or understand things. Affective learning goes beyond understanding and includes an appreciation or love for something. Psychomotor learning is incorporating something into our daily functional lives.

The goal of discipleship is to become so much like Jesus that our love for Him goes beyond cognitive knowledge. The Bible commands us to love God with all our hearts (Matthew 22:37), which is affective/emotional. Knowing about God is not enough; we are to love Him.

In addition, James 1:22 commands us to be doers of the word. God expects us to put our love for Him into action, which is psychomotor/functional learning. Jesus even said that if we love Him, we will do what He commands (John 14:15).

I find it amusing that the world has only recently discovered these principles with which God created us and that Jesus understood and used. Let us not be content to just know Jesus. We need to love and obey Him.
