Church Membership

It used to be customary to be a member of a local church. Some denominations like Lutherans and Catholics would automatically assign you to a local parish church. If you lived in the community and considered yourself a Lutheran (or Catholic or Episcopalian), you were a member of the local parish church whether you wanted to be or not. Baptists, Methodists, and other congregational denominations encouraged you to find a local church to join vountarily. The traditional church covenant which many **Baptist** churches still adhere contains an admonition that the individual will immediately seek out a new church to join should that person move to a new community.

Membership in a group, whether it be the local church, a fraternal organization, or a club was much more common in previous generations. Being a part of something greater than ourselves or being able to share a common interest with others was an important part of society in years past. Our membership in such organizations, especially the church, was a part of our personal identity.

However, in recent years many people have lost interest in joining organizations, including the church. In the post-modern era, formal

membership is simply no longer seen as an important part of everyday life. Our identities have become defined more by our occupations and outside interests than by our social interactions.

Consequently, many people simply no longer go through the formal process of joining the local church. Those same people may regularly attend and participate in various activities but yet see no need to take the final step toward official membership. Many of those same individuals may not even realize that there is such a thing as official membership.

So why should we take that final step? What is different about the church that makes it worthy of our joining versus a local club or social activity? A club or social organization is based on a common interest or activity. For example, one could join a local gardening club and share gardening experiences with others in the community. However, that same person could quit the club and still be an accomplished gardener.

The church, on the other hand, is much more than a mere club. The church is the body of Christ. Since the Holy Spirit has gifted and called each of us differently, withdrawal from the local church is the equivalent of being cut off from the body. God has called us to serve Him by

participating in the local church (cf. Hebrews 10:25).

Some might still say that official membership is unnecessary. One can participate without actually going through the official membership process. However, those who are not of the official membership cannot be held accountable by the church. Spiritual accountability is a major function of the church. Matthew 18:15-20 addresses the method by which Christians are to hold one another accountable and by which they are to be reconciled, but that accountability must be accomplished within the context of the local church.

If you are one that regularly participates but has never taken the final step toward membership, I urge you to do so. The church is not a mere club. We are the body and bride of Christ. As the body of Christ, we cannot sit on the fence. God expects us to be wholly committed to Him, including our accountability in the church.

Church membership begins by accepting God's forgiveness in Christ and then publicly declaring that decision to accept Christ. You can do that by presenting yourself to the church at the end of the service during the final hymn. You will then be baptized by immersion, unless you have already done so previously. Then, let's get busy as the body of Christ.


Hardeetown Student Ministries
