Real Revival

Our church has a revival scheduled for this month. Fall revivals have been a part of Baptist life for generations. Many churches within the Baptist association used to coordinate the timing of their revivals so each church could support the others. Church members would take turns attending the other churches' revivals.

The format that a revival would take has changed over the years. Several decades ago a church revival would often last for two weeks. If people in the community were coming to Christ, the church might continue its revival indefinitely, often lasting for several weeks. After several years, churches tended to reduce the length of their revivals to only one week, beginning on Sunday and ending Friday. Most churches now have reduced the length of their revivals to four days—Sunday through Wednesday. Most people just do not have the time in their busy schedules for a lengthy revival.

Another form that revivals used to take was the downtown tent revival. Pentecostal and Fundamentalist churches still conduct the occasional tent revival, but for most churches, tent revivals are a thing of the past. Potential participants are no longer willing to endure hot, humid evenings in a tent with-

out air conditioning or comfortable seating.

Regardless of the format of the revival, the goal of most church revivals has been twofold: enjoying a few extra worship services with someone else preaching and inviting friends from other churches to attend. Unfortunately, neither of these goals is found in scripture. There is certainly nothing sinful about enjoying the worship of Almighty God or inviting one's friends to worship with you. However, neither of these activities tends to result in genuine spiritual revival. The traditional fall revival long ago fell into the rut of simply being a thing to do. It joined the list of church programs that have lost real spiritual direction and effectiveness.

Occasionally, churches focused on evangelism through their revivals. Church members would invite friends and acquaintances that did not know Jesus. The goal was to get those who were not saved into the service so the preacher could share the gospel from the pulpit. The preacher was expected to focus on evangelistic sermons. Frequently, those in the audience who were not saved would respond. Certainly, that was a valid, scriptural objective of the revival.

However, evangelism, while a valid objective, is not revival. Evangelistic sermons

result in neither spiritual growth nor revival for the existing church member.

If a church is to experience genuine revival, the church members need to draw closer to Christ. Revival involves those that already have a relationship with Christ repenting and becoming more committed to Him. People need to get serious about serving God. That is real revival.

Evangelism is a necessary part of fulfilling the Great Commission, but revival should be focused on those that have already been saved. If God's people get on fire for Jesus, the church would not need to have a revival in order to reach more people for Christ. Evangelism is a natural result of being committed to Christ. If the church is on fire for Jesus, the church will share Jesus out of love.

A sign of a church in need of revival is a church that neglects outreach and evangelism. When the church is more concerned with internal relationships and fellowship than with sharing Jesus, revival is overdue.

The challenge this month is to get on fire for Jesus. Dr. Jerry Nash will be preaching for us Sunday, October 23, through Wednesday, October 26. Invite your friends if you like, but the focus is on our own members revitalizing our relationship with Jesus. How about you?
