Dear Families,

Many of our families will remember you were invited to attend a community meeting last year to discuss the strengths of our school and ask the question 'How could we improve?' This meeting was held prior to the School Review and the information collected then combined with feedback from the review process has been invaluable to guiding the direction of our school. The changes that have been implemented since this time last year have been substantial, particularly the introduction of an agreed instructional model which all staff plan for and deliver. Staff have also joined together for extensive professional learning about how to teach reading in a more individualised and stimulating way. New learning can sometimes be challenging for our staff too as it can be difficult to be pushed out of your comfort zone. I have been so proud and excited to attend professional learning meetings and listen to the deep conversations about the teaching of reading. This instructional model has been so successful that staff have elected to use the theory in other subject areas. At Eagle Point Primary School, we are lucky to have such dedicated staff that are willing to try new things and step out of what is known and comfortable.

We are always looking for ways to improve outcomes for all students whether this be in the area of academics or social skills. Other significant changes to our school has been the introduction of the school improvement strategy Professional Learning Communities or PLC as it is known. Mrs Langley and Mrs Clarke attended a 2 day seminar in Melbourne last week to further our understanding of using an inquiry based model to achieve success. Mrs Langley also attended a course with me this week to continue to deepen our understanding of ourselves as leaders and how we can use this knowledge to understand what we truly stand for.

Early next term we will be holding another community meeting to which all families will be invited. Together I would like us to explore 4 questions through discussions with other families and recording all of the ideas. I hope as many families can attend as possible to provide useful feedback to the school.
