Dear Families,

It is always wonderful to hear about present and past students of Eagle Point Primary School out and about doing amazing things and this week I am very proud to share some achievements of our students with the school community.

On Tuesday 4, of our students travelled to Newborough to compete at the Regional Athletics Carnival. This is the highest number of students we have ever had representing us at this level. Students competing at this carnival attend schools from the Victorian NSW border in the East to Dandenong in the West so it covers a huge area.

Congratulations to each of the students who have exceeded my expectations. Harley Ryan came 1st in the 200m heat and 2nd in the 100m heat. On final times, he came 4th in each overall! Isabel Kynoch ran in 3rd place in the 100m heat and on final times came 4th overall. Cooper Claridge came 5th overall in high jump after clearing 115cm. Cooper is only 9 years old and competed against 10 year olds.

Hannah Svetey also had a very successful day coming 1st in the 800m and 2nd in the 1500m. With a first and second place she has gualified for the State Athletics Carnival which will be held in Melbourne next Thursday. Congratulations to all of you, this is an amazing achievement.

Many of us will remember Kim Erwin who graduated with our 2018 class. Kim has been selected to play golf in the PGA Junior Australian Championships which will be held in Queensland later this year. Choice Theory Professional Learning

As you are aware, Eagle Point Primary School has adopted Choice Theory as a model for staff and students to strive for success and understand quality learning. All staff members who work at Eagle Point Primary School receive 4 days of training prior to the beginning of the school year. The training assists them with understanding the common language of the school and the theory behind the systems we have in place for all students. Over the past years we have encouraged parents to join in the training and we are able to offer places again for the 2020 training. Fishcare Excursion

On Tuesday 15th October, 25 students from across the school attended a Fishcare Victoria excursion to the Mitchell River. On the excursion students learnt about the range of fish, shark and other native fish available in the East Gippsland region. Students also learnt about size and bag limits and the reasons why these rules exist. The students also learnt about how to correctly handle fish before they practiced casting lures with only a few needing to be retrieved from trees and bushes!

After the workshop students got to try their luck for some fish in the Mitchell river. Although much bait and tackle was sacrificed to the river, fish were caught! Blaze from grade 3 caught a legal 29cm bream which brought about many smiles and much excitement. Soon after, Sabbi from grade 3 caught a fantastic 34cm bream. All fish were returned to the water unharmed and all students had a fantastic time. Eagle Point would like to thank Fishcare Victoria for a fun and informative session.
