Dear Families,

It is with great pride I attended the Junior Rotary Community Awards evening last night. Mrs Clarke and I escorted six students to receive their awards in front of parents and families at the Uniting Church Bairnsdale. The Rotary Junior Community Awards is a program, similar to The Duke of Edinburgh Award, which began in Bairnsdale many years ago. The program was adopted by the Mitchell Rotary Group and is offered each year to Year 6 students only. The program has been so successful that it is now offered in many countries around the world and in all States of Australia. To complete the award students must be committed to improving themselves in five different areas including Physical Recreation, Community Service, Environmental Awareness, The Arts and Social Experiences. Some of these topics require students to commit to a plan for a minimum of ten weeks and others require attending meetings, visiting art performances and displays and experiencing a religion or set of beliefs different to their own. Although the award in itself is not difficult to complete, students need to be dedicated and manage their time to complete not only the requirements but also the reports and displays needed to hand in a completed award. The award is assessed by Rotarian volunteers prior to the students attending the Awards Night. Congratulations to Enzo, Amelie, Isabel, Alana, Kate and Hannah who all completed the requirements for the award and received their certificates this year. I would also like to recognise Amelie and Enzo who spoke at the ceremony on behalf of the group. They interviewed each person to ensure they were equally represented and prepared an entertaining and interesting speech.

#### **Annual Christmas Parade**

The Annual Bairnsdale Christmas Parade will again be held on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> December. Eagle Point Primary School are keen to enter a float in the parade again as we have over the past two years. If you are interested in joining a group of interested parents in arranging, decorating and organising a float then there will be a meeting at 2:30pm Friday 15<sup>th</sup> November in the Old School Building to get a plan in place. This year's theme is A Country Christmas and we are thinking this could be a great opportunity to celebrate our school's 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

#### **Early Arrivals**

This term we seem to have an increasing number of students arriving at school quite early. In some cases students are arriving from 8:10am. Please be reminded that staff do not begin to supervise the yard until 8:45am as they use the time they are here before school to organise resources and set up classrooms ready for the school day. Students are also welcome to come into the Old School Building from 8:30am to share some breakfast. I am sure you are well aware that a number of our staff have children that are also students of the schools therefore they may be at school early as they arrive with parents. If it is unavoidable that students arrive at school on the odd occasion we request that they stay in under the

veranda in the eating area where they can be seen from the staff room.

#### **Parking and Road Usage**

As I am sure most parents are aware, the roads around our school become quite congested around drop off and pick up times. Please be considerate of our neighbours and park in designated spaces. The bus parking area is strictly for bus use between 8:00-9:00am and from 3:00-4:00pm. Please do not park across the driveways of the houses in Eagle Point Road as the neighbours become frustrated with us when they cannot leave or access their properties. If you are not getting out of the car and are waiting to collect students please line up in School Road and use the pick-up zone outside the red gates. Finally please do not ever park on nature strips and road edges, this is an extremely dangerous practice as children are not expecting cars to be on the grassed and footpath areas. Although we understand that the roads around our school can be busy, a short wait is far safer for everyone.

#### **Lunch Orders**

Due to swimming being on a Friday, lunch orders will not be available on Friday the 15<sup>th</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup> of November, instead they will be available on Thursday the 14<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup> of November. There will be no lunch orders in December.

#### **Choice Theory Professional Learning**

As you are aware, Eagle Point Primary School has adopted Choice Theory as a model for staff and students to strive for success and understand quality learning. All staff members who work at Eagle Point Primary School receive four days of training prior to the beginning of the school year. The training assists them with understanding the common language of the school and the theory behind the systems we have in place for all students. Over the past years we have encouraged parents to join in the training and we are able to offer places again for the 2020 training. Zofia - I can now swim the length of the pool in freestyle and backstroke.


Isla - I have quality swimming because I am learning how to do backstroke.
