# 1 JOHN 5:13-21 (NASB)

<sup>13</sup> These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life. <sup>14</sup> This is the confidence which we have before Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. <sup>15</sup> And if we know that He hears us *in* whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests which we have asked from Him.

<sup>16</sup> If anyone sees his brother committing a sin not *leading* to death, he shall ask and *God* will for him give life to those who commit sin not *leading* to death. There is a sin *leading* to death; I do not say that he should make request for this. <sup>17</sup> All unrighteousness is sin, and there is a sin not *leading* to death.

<sup>18</sup> We know that no one who is born of God sins; but He who was born of God keeps him, and the evil one does not touch him. <sup>19</sup> We know that we are of God, and that the whole world lies in *the power of* the evil one. <sup>20</sup> And we know that the Son of God has come, and has given us understanding so that we may know Him who is true; and we are in Him who is true, in His Son Jesus Christ. This is the true God and eternal life.

<sup>21</sup> Little children, guard yourselves from idols.

## REVIEW

In his concluding remarks John returns to his overall goal: to know the Father. Knowledge and faith are so intimately connected; they reveal what God has established to be true in our hearts – and help us reject what is untrue.

#### STUDY IT

- Verses 13-15. Why do followers of Christ have confidence?
- **Verses. 16-17.** What promise do we have when we pray for those who struggle with sin?
- Verses 18-20. How does Jesus protect his followers from evil? (See also John 10:1-18)
- How does John end the letter? What does idolatry reveal about the relationship between *knowledge of God* and his promised life?

- What have you learned throughout this study? What difference will this make in your life?
