#### **A**DULTERY

Conjugal infidelity. An adulterer was a man who had illicit intercourse with a married or a engaged woman, and such a woman was an adulteress. Intercourse between a married man and an unmarried woman was fornication. Adultery was regarded as a great social wrong, as well as a great sin.

The Mosaic law (Num. 5:11-31) prescribed that the suspected wife should be tried by the ordeal of the "water of jealousy." There is, however, no recorded instance of the application of this law. In subsequent times the Rabbis made various regulations with the view of discovering the guilty party, and of bringing about a divorce. It has been inferred from John 8:1-11 that this sin became very common during the age preceding the destruction of Jerusalem.

Idolatry, covetousness, and apostasy are spoken of as adultery spiritually (Jer. 3:6, 8, 9; Ezek. 16:32; Hos. 1, 2, 3 Rev. 2:22). An apostate church is an adulteress (Isa. 1:21; Ezek. 23:4, 7, 37), and the Jews are styled "an adulterous generation" (Matt. 12:39). (Compare Rev. 12.)

## 3. The purity of the camp

## Numbers 5

<sup>1</sup>The LORD gave these instructions to Moses: <sup>2</sup>"Command the people of Israel to remove anyone from the camp who has a contagious skin disease or a discharge, or who has been defiled by touching a dead person. <sup>3</sup>This applies to men and women alike. Remove them so they will not defile the camp, where I live among you." <sup>4</sup>So the Israelites did just as the LORD had commanded Moses and removed such people from the camp.

<sup>5</sup>Then the LORD said to Moses, <sup>6</sup>"Give these instructions to the people of Israel: If any of the people—men or women—betray the LORD by doing wrong to another person, they are guilty. <sup>7</sup>They must confess their sin and make full restitution for what they have done, adding a penalty of 20 percent and returning it to the person who was wronged. <sup>8</sup>But if the person who was wronged is dead, and there are no near relatives to whom restitution can be made, it belongs to the LORD and must be given to the priest, along with a ram for atonement. <sup>9</sup>All the sacred gifts that the Israelites bring to a priest will belong to him. <sup>10</sup>Each priest may keep the sacred donations that he receives."

#### Protecting Marital Faithfulness

<sup>11</sup>And the LORD said to Moses, <sup>12</sup>"Say to the people of Israel: 'suppose a man's wife goes astray and is unfaithful to her husband. <sup>13</sup>Suppose she sleeps with another man, but there is no witness since she was not caught in the act. <sup>14</sup>If her husband becomes jealous and suspicious of his wife, even if she has not defiled herself, <sup>15</sup>the husband must bring his wife to the priest with an offering of two quarts <sup>o</sup> of barley flour to be presented on her behalf. Do not mix it with olive oil or frankincense, for it is a jealousy offering—an offering of inquiry to find out if she is guilty.

16"The priest must then present her before the LORD. <sup>17</sup>He must take some holy water in a clay jar and mix it with dust from the Tabernacle floor. <sup>18</sup>When he has presented her before the LORD, he must unbind her hair and place the offering of inquiry—the jealousy offering—in her hands to determine whether or not her husband's suspicions are justified. The priest will stand before her, holding the jar of bitter water that brings a curse to those who are guilty. <sup>19</sup>The priest will put the woman under oath and say to her, "If no other man has slept with you, and you have not defiled yourself by being unfaithful, may you be immune from the effects of this bitter water that causes the curse. <sup>20</sup>But if you have gone astray while under your husband's authority and defiled yourself by sleeping with another man"—<sup>21</sup>at this point the priest must put the woman under this oath—"then may the people see that the LORD's curse is upon you when he makes you infertile. <sup>6</sup> <sup>22</sup>Now may this water that brings the curse enter your body and make you infertile. <sup>6</sup> And the woman will be required to say, "Yes, let it be so." <sup>23</sup>Then the priest will write these curses on a piece of leather and wash them off into the bitter water. <sup>24</sup>He will then make the woman drink the bitter water, so it may bring on the curse and cause bitter suffering in cases of guilt.

<sup>25</sup>"Then the priest will take the jealousy offering from the woman's hand, lift it up before the LORD, and carry it to the altar. <sup>26</sup>He will take a handful as a token portion and burn it on the altar. Then he will require the woman to drink the water. <sup>27</sup>If she has defiled herself by being unfaithful to her husband, the water that brings the curse will cause bitter suffering. She will become infertile, on and her name will

become a curse word among her people. <sup>28</sup>But if she has not defiled herself and is pure, she will be unharmed and will still be able to have children.

<sup>29</sup>"This is the ritual law for dealing with jealousy. If a woman defiles herself by being unfaithful to her husband, <sup>30</sup>or if a man is overcome with jealousy and suspicion that his wife has been unfaithful, the husband must present his wife before the LORD, and the priest will apply this entire ritual law to her. <sup>31</sup>The husband will be innocent of any guilt in this matter, but his wife will be held accountable for her sin."

## JOHN 8

#### JESUS FORGIVES AN ADULTEROUS WOMAN

<sup>1</sup>Jesus returned to the Mount of Olives, <sup>2</sup>but early the next morning he was back again at the Temple. A crowd soon gathered, and he sat down and taught them. <sup>3</sup>As he was speaking, the teachers of religious law and Pharisees brought a woman they had caught in the act of adultery. They put her in front of the crowd.

<sup>4</sup>"Teacher," they said to Jesus, "this woman was caught in the very act of adultery. <sup>5</sup>The law of Moses says to stone her. What do you say?"

<sup>6</sup>They were trying to trap him into saying something they could use against him, but Jesus stooped down and wrote in the dust with his finger. <sup>7</sup>They kept demanding an answer, so he stood up again and said, "All right, stone her. But let those who have never sinned throw the first stones!" <sup>8</sup>Then he stooped down again and wrote in the dust.

<sup>9</sup>When the accusers heard this, they slipped away one by one, beginning with the oldest, until only Jesus was left in the middle of the crowd with the woman. <sup>10</sup>Then Jesus stood up again and said to her, "Where are your accusers? Didn't even one of them condemn you?"

<sup>11</sup>"No, Lord," she said.

And Jesus said, "Neither do I. Go and sin no more."

#### Avoid Immoral Women

# PROVERBS 5

<sup>1</sup>My son, pay attention to my wisdom; listen carefully to my wise counsel. <sup>2</sup>Then you will learn to be discreet and will store up knowledge.

<sup>3</sup>The lips of an immoral woman are as sweet as honey, and her mouth is smoother than oil. <sup>4</sup>But the result is as bitter as poison, sharp as a double-edged sword. <sup>5</sup>Her feet go down to death; her steps lead straight to the grave. <sup>6</sup>For she does not care about the path to life. She staggers down a crooked trail and doesn't even realize where it leads.

<sup>7</sup>So now, my sons, listen to me. Never stray from what I am about to say: <sup>8</sup>Run from her! Don't go near the door of her house! <sup>9</sup>If you do, you will lose your honor and hand over to merciless people everything you have achieved in life. <sup>10</sup>Strangers will obtain your wealth, and someone else will enjoy the fruit of your labor. <sup>11</sup>Afterward you will groan in anguish when disease consumes your body, <sup>12</sup>and you will say, "How I hated discipline! If only I had not demanded my own way! <sup>13</sup>Oh, why didn't I listen to my teachers? Why didn't I pay attention to those who gave me instruction? <sup>14</sup>I have come to the brink of utter ruin, and now I must face public disgrace."

<sup>15</sup>Drink water from your own well—share your love only with your wife. <sup>o</sup> <sup>16</sup>Why spill the water of your springs in public, having sex with just anyone? <sup>o</sup> <sup>17</sup>You should reserve it for yourselves. Don't share it with strangers.

<sup>18</sup>Let your wife be a fountain of blessing for you. Rejoice in the wife of your youth. <sup>19</sup>She is a loving doe, a graceful deer. Let her breasts satisfy you always. May you always be captivated by her love. <sup>20</sup>Why be captivated, my son, with an immoral woman, or embrace the breasts of an adulterous woman?

<sup>21</sup>For the LORD sees clearly what a man does, examining every path he takes. <sup>22</sup>An evil man is held captive by his own sins; they are ropes that catch and hold him. <sup>23</sup>He will die for lack of self-control; he will be lost because of his incredible folly.

## PROVERBS 6

¹My child, o if you co-sign a loan for a friend or guarantee the debt of someone you hardly know—²if you have trapped yourself by your agreement and are caught by what you said—³quick, get out of it if you possibly can! You have placed yourself at your friend's mercy. Now swallow your pride; go and beg to have your name erased. ⁴Don't put it off. Do it now! Don't rest until you do. ⁵Save yourself like a deer escaping from a hunter, like a bird fleeing from a net.

<sup>6</sup>Take a lesson from the ants, you lazybones. Learn from their ways and be wise! <sup>7</sup>Even though they have no prince, governor, or ruler to make them work, <sup>8</sup>they labor hard all summer, gathering food for the winter. <sup>9</sup>But you, lazybones, how long will you sleep? When will you wake up? I want you to learn this lesson: <sup>10</sup>A little extra sleep, a little more slumber, a little folding of the hands to rest—<sup>11</sup>and poverty will pounce on you like a bandit; scarcity will attack you like an armed robber.

<sup>12</sup>Here is a description of worthless and wicked people: They are constant liars, <sup>13</sup>signaling their true intentions to their friends by making signs with their eyes and feet and fingers. <sup>14</sup>Their perverted hearts plot evil. They stir up trouble constantly. <sup>15</sup>But they will be destroyed suddenly, broken beyond all hope of healing.

<sup>16</sup>There are six things the LORD hates—no, seven things he detests:

- haughty eyes,
  - a lying tongue,
  - hands that kill the innocent,
- a heart that plots evil,
  - feet that race to do wrong,
- <sup>19</sup> a false witness who pours out lies,
  - a person who sows discord among brothers.

<sup>20</sup>My son, obey your father's commands, and don't neglect your mother's teaching. <sup>21</sup>Keep their words always in your heart. Tie them around your neck. <sup>22</sup>Wherever you walk, their counsel can lead you. When you sleep, they will protect you. When you wake up in the morning, they will advise you. <sup>23</sup>For these commands and this teaching are a lamp to light the way ahead of you. The correction of discipline is the way to life.

<sup>24</sup>These commands and this teaching will keep you from the immoral woman, from the smooth tongue of an adulterous woman. <sup>25</sup>Don't lust for her beauty. Don't let her coyness seduce you. <sup>26</sup>For a prostitute will bring you to poverty, and sleeping with another man's wife may cost you your very life. <sup>27</sup>Can a man scoop fire into his lap and not be burned? <sup>28</sup>Can he walk on hot coals and not blister his feet? <sup>29</sup>So it is with the man who sleeps with another man's wife. He who embraces her will not go unpunished.

<sup>30</sup>Excuses might be found for a thief who steals because he is starving. <sup>31</sup>But if he is caught, he will be fined seven times as much as he stole, even if it means selling everything in his house to pay it back.

<sup>32</sup>But the man who commits adultery is an utter fool, for he destroys his own soul. <sup>33</sup>Wounds and constant disgrace are his lot. His shame will never be erased. <sup>34</sup>For the woman's husband will be furious in his jealousy, and he will have no mercy in his day of vengeance. <sup>35</sup>There is no compensation or bribe that will satisfy him.

# Another Warning about Immoral Women

## PROVERBS 7

<sup>1</sup>Follow my advice, my son; always treasure my commands. <sup>2</sup>Obey them and live! Guard my teachings as your most precious possession. <sup>o</sup> <sup>3</sup>Tie them on your fingers as a reminder. Write them deep within your heart.

<sup>4</sup>Love wisdom like a sister; make insight a beloved member of your family. <sup>5</sup>Let them hold you back from an affair with an immoral woman, from listening to the flattery of an adulterous woman.

<sup>6</sup>I was looking out the window of my house one day <sup>7</sup>and saw a simpleminded young man who lacked common sense. <sup>8</sup>He was crossing the street near the house of an immoral woman. He was strolling down the path by her house <sup>9</sup>at twilight, as the day was fading, as the dark of night set in. <sup>10</sup>The woman approached him, dressed seductively and sly of heart. <sup>11</sup>She was the brash, rebellious type who never stays at home. <sup>12</sup>She is often seen in the streets and markets, soliciting at every corner.

<sup>13</sup>She threw her arms around him and kissed him, and with a brazen look she said, <sup>14</sup>"I've offered my sacrifices and just finished my vows. <sup>15</sup>It's you I was looking for! I came out to find you, and here you are! <sup>16</sup>My bed is spread with colored sheets of finest linen imported from Egypt. <sup>17</sup>I've perfumed my bed with myrrh, aloes, and cinnamon. <sup>18</sup>Come, let's drink our fill of love until morning. Let's enjoy each other's caresses, <sup>19</sup>for my husband is not home. He's away on a long trip. <sup>20</sup>He has taken a wallet full of money with him, and he won't return until later in the month."

<sup>21</sup>So she seduced him with her pretty speech. With her flattery she enticed him. <sup>22</sup>He followed her at once, like an ox going to the slaughter or like a trapped stag, <sup>23</sup>awaiting the arrow that would pierce its heart. He was like a bird flying into a snare, little knowing it would cost him his life.

<sup>24</sup>Listen to me, my sons, and pay attention to my words. <sup>25</sup>Don't let your hearts stray away toward her. Don't wander down her wayward path. <sup>26</sup>For she has been the ruin of many; numerous men have been her victims. <sup>27</sup>Her house is the road to the grave. <sup>•</sup> Her bedroom is the den of death.
