Gold is generally considered a time-tested safe-haven asset, the price of which has historically held up well in times of high inflation, market volatility and geopolitical uncertainty. Gold is a finite resource, and therefore increases in value over time. Knowing this, many investors turn to the precious metal in an effort to protect their money. And those holding it in their portfolios were rewarded in December 2023

when the **price of gold hit an all-time high of \$2,135 per ounce!** For those of us afflicted with gold fever and who enjoy prospecting and mining as a hobby, the price of gold doesn't make much difference. Most small-scale prospectors seem to get much more pleasure from the process of finding the gold rather than selling it. It's the thrill of the hunt! When you think about pot holes, you probably picture annoying driving hazards in the middle of the road that you try to avoid at all costs. That hole in the asphalt can cause a flat tire and help throw your car's alignment out of whack! But a pot hole in a rock that's located in a gold-bearing stream or river is something you DON'T want to steer clear of the next time you're out prospecting. The Crazy Crusher brand Rock Crusher is 100 percent steel, and it is 100 percent made in the USA! The jaws are made of 3/8 steel, and the face has horizontal welds across them that not only help grip and pull down rock pieces, it also prevents wear on the actual jaws. On the moving jaw, vertical "teeth"



were added to help dig in and crack the hardest rocks! The adjustable jaw moves from a 1/2 inch opening to all the way closed, for that final grind to get your samples as small as you can for testing. The very bottom of the jaws is what does the "grinding" of the rock into sand sized particles and smaller, some so small it is "air borne." Eventually, like all things, the jaws can wear away, but with this style of adjustable jaw, you can keep moving it in tight for a long time! Also available with hitch mount (shown). Although this item was first invented and patented for crushing ore in the field, this handy machine has also been discovered by artists for the purpose of crushing glass for artwork,

durable ABS plastic in Canada, and otherwise known as the River Robber Sluice. Now it's even better because it's made in the USA using original molds! This sluice cleans out in seconds -- no matting, miner's moss or carpets -- and is an amazing gold trap! Le Trap sluices run well in faster water as well as in low pressure water flows. History Nugget: Queen Mine Tour Bisbee, AZ



Whether it's mining for gold, silver, lead, zinc or other precious metals, it's always fun to follow in the historic footsteps of the old time miners. To do exactly that and learn how copper and other ore was first mined in Bisbee, Arizona, take the underground Queen Mine tour.

Outfitted with hard hat, miner's headlamp and a neon vest, visitors ride 1,500 feet into the mine and learn about equipment, techniques, dangers and a century worth of history. Tour guides are actual retired miners, so you know you'll get the real highlights of working underground. You'll learn about blasting with dynamite, the role of mules, and even how miners went to the bathroom while working in the mines!

Electricity changed the world from a predominantly rural society to the industrial age, and copper wire was needed to carry that electricity— and lots of it. Thanks to the insatiable demand for electricity, Bisbee was one of the greatest copper camps in the world. In nearly 100 years of continuous production (late 1880s until the mine closed in 1975), the local mines produced metals valued at \$6.1 billion (at 1975 prices). This staggering amount of wealth came from the estimated production of 8,032,352,000 pounds of copper, 2,871,786 ounces of gold, 77,162,986 ounces of silver, 304,627,600 pounds of lead and 371,945,900 pounds of zinc.
