I want to give you an update on where we are in <u>RESUMING OUR IN-PERSON</u> <u>WORSHIP!</u> I know many are looking forward to that day!

The Plan for Resuming In-Person Worship, Phase One was approved by our Administrative Council last Sunday. Our plans have been reviewed by our District Superintendent; Dr. Randy Wild gave us high marks for the great detail in our plan.

There was a great deal of discussion in the Administrative Council meeting encouraging setting the date to resume. I've made a number of calls this week with Red Oak pastors and United Methodist pastors in Ellis County. In addition, I've reviewed current data in our county.

We are taking steps to resume in-person worship soon. The tentative date we have set is OCTOBER 25. We will be reviewing the data in the hope we can hold that date. In the interim, we are putting together the volunteers needed to form teams in disinfecting, hospitality, taking temperatures in entering the building, and other matters. (See Ways You Can Serve article on page 2.)

Many of you have received surveys to indicate your interest in attending or not. These surveys were received via "Survey Monkey," and paper copies are available at the church as well. If you have not received it, you can pick up a paper copy at the

church office; there is also a copy at the end of this newsletter. *We need to receive all survey responses by October 9.* In addition, you will receive a waiver to fill out, if attending, that insures you understand any risk you take in returning to worship.

Please know our worship experience will be very different. We will need to wear our masks in the building, use hand sanitizer, and social distance in available pews. There will be no bulletins, passing of the offering plates, or choir. We will not greet one another as we have in the past. Holy Communion will be different. We will have special music, and those attending can hum or sing the songs and hymns with masks in place. But we will be back! This is all about our safety. Be at peace.

RECEIVING THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION THIS SUNDAY

This Sunday, October 4th, is WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY! Once again, we will celebrate HOLY COMMUNION remotely. This means Pastor Mike will consecrate the Sacraments in our sanctuary as he always does, and you will partake of the communion elements at home.

You have two options in receiving Holy Communion. We have packaged communion elements that you can pick up. Under the top seal is a wafer, and under the other seal is a communion cup with juice. These can be picked up at the church office Saturday morning, October 3rd, from 9:00 – 11:00 AM. If you cannot pick one up, you can use any kind of bread with some form of liquid at home. As you watch the worship service online, you may partake of these elements as Pastor Mike consecrates the Bread and the Cup and then invites you to take communion.

It is critical as we prepare to open in-person worship services that we have people in place that will assist in keeping everyone safe and comfortable in worship. If you plan to attend in-person worship on our

target date of October 25, please let us know if you can volunteer to assist in ensuring the morning runs smoothly. Listed below are areas in which we need teams of volunteers on Sunday morning to:

- Stand outside entrance doors to encourage social distancing as people arrive and exit
- Distribute masks (if needed), take temperatures, and ask health questions
- Hold open entrance doors to sanctuary and assist in locating seating on identified pews
- Assist in taking attendance
- Assist in dismissing individuals/families at the end of the service

Please pray about these opportunities to serve and let the church office know if you would like to serve in any way. There will be a brief training session for all volunteers before opening in-person worship.

He's A Good, Good Father

If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask him?

Matthew 7:11

Any of us who have been blessed with children know the joy that comes from giving them gifts. When we have a special gift for one of our children, we can't wait to see their eyes light up when they open it or to receive a warm hug of appreciation. We delight in sharing our love through the giving of gifts.

Think how much hurt we might experience, however, if we went to the trouble of making or purchasing a special gift for our children only to have them refuse to accept it. Even worse, what if they refused our gift because they didn't believe we were the kind of parents who took delight in sharing with their children. In other words, they didn't think we loved them!


Jesus knew this experience all too well. In the verses leading up to the passage above, he asks those he is teaching if they would give their children something bad or even harmful when they asked for something to eat. This was a rhetorical question; obviously none of them would. He then asks them to think about a simple fact: If they, being imperfect parents, knew how to provide good things for their children, *how much more* would their heavenly Father do so for His.

I know that the "health and wealth" message is unpopular, in some cases for good reason, but not expecting God to enjoy giving good things to His children, even lavishing His goodness upon them, is just as erroneous and hurtful to our heavenly Father. Throughout scripture we are reminded that God delights in prospering his children in all ways...success, material wealth, good health, loving relationships. Even as Paul exhorts Timothy to warn those who are rich in this world's goods not to trust in their riches, he continues by telling him to encourage them to "trust in God, who gives us all things richly to enjoy."

Sometimes the church swings too far toward the extreme in which we see this life as only a pilgrimage toward something better with a God who just helps us get by. I think our Father would like to see his children enjoying the many good things He provides on a daily basis and, yes, even expecting Him to sometimes lavish his love upon us, blessing us abundantly. Certainly, we will go through suffering and hardship, perhaps even experiencing very lean times, but God's goodness is always with us, and His blessings are ours to enjoy. As the praise song says, "He's a good, good Father."

The Youth would like you, our church family, to know that we have prayed for you weekly, and miss you being able to worship with in person.






