November is a significant time in our United Methodist Church. Last Sunday, November 1, we honored our members who, in the last 12 months, have graduated to Heaven to be with Jesus! We also celebrated many of our loved ones who are now in Heaven with Jesus!

November 10, 17, and 24, we will have our stewardship emphasis. On the 10th and 17th, my sermons will be about this theme, and a few of our laity will share their stewardship witness. **November 24th will be our Commitment Sunday.** This is a similar schedule as you had last year. In 2020 we will have a new program. We expect to go to an emphasis not tacked on at the end of the year, but an emphasis throughout the year.

In January, 2020, our Finance Committee will be engaged in a stewardship educational resource written by the premiere authority on giving in the UMC. Other interested leaders will be encouraged to attend as well. This will give us a multi-faceted emphasis on giving, highlighting the fact that our stewardship is about God. The resource is *God vs. Money*, by Clif Christopher.

My friends, **stewardship** is **about God.** It's not about what we give to the church. That is part of the end result, of course, but the stewardship of our time, talents, and treasure is about our relationship with God. **Too often in the church the focus is on scarcity.** A need arises in us or a new ministry is considered. The first question raised is, "How do we pay for it?" The focus is on **scarcity.**

BUT GOD IS NOT ABOUT SCARCITY; GOD IS ABOUT ABUNDANCE. If we have faith in God, we recognize the **ABUNDANCE OF GOD** is all around us. The abundance of God can be within us. This is all about our relationship with God!


Community Thanksgiving Service

Notes from Larry McCord United in Thanksgiving



Let all things now living a song of thanksgiving to God the Creator triumphantly raise. from "Let All Things Now Living" by Katherine K. Davis

I am so fortunate to have had parents who loved the great hymns and anthems of the church and introduced them to our choir. From time to time, I dust these off and bring them to our choir to learn, continuing this tradition of great music. One such anthem that was later made a hymn that still appears in "The Faith We Sing" is "Let All Things Now Living."



The author of the text, Katherine K. Davis (pictured to the left), wrote more than 800 instrumental and vocal works, including anthems, operas and cantatas. Learning piano and composing from her youth in Missouri, she went on to attend Wellesley College, receiving her BA in music and receiving the Billings Prize for Composition (named after William Billings, whom I mentioned in our service on American hymns last summer). She remained as an assistant at the college, teaching music theory and piano, while pursuing further degree work at the New England Conservatory of

Music. Throughout her career, Ms. Davis had a special concern for the lack of music for girls and untrained singers, composing many of her works to fill this void. Perhaps Ms. Davis' best-known composition was "The Little Drummer Boy" or "Carol of the Drum," which she wrote in 1941 and which was performed and recorded by the Von Trapp Family Singers (of <a href="https://doi.org/10.1001/jhes.20

Ms. Davis often wrote under a pseudonym, including the name John Cowley, under which she wrote "Let All Things Now Living" as an anthem in 1939. She set the text to the well-known Irish tune THE ASH GROVE. (I remember singing the original song during summer camp at Lake Bridgeport). The text of "Let All Things Now Living," the opening of which is quoted above, brings together many of the best known scriptural references to thanksgiving, especially Psalms 19 and 150, with images from the story of the Exodus. God, who "fashioned and made us," "protected and stayed us," now "guides us on to the end of our days" with, among other things "a pillar of fire shining forth in the night." Since this great Creator, Provider and Protector is already proclaimed divine by "the hills and the mountains, the rivers and fountains," surely we should join them in "voicing our love and rejoicing" until "all things now living unite in thanksgiving." When we join our voices in praise and love for our God, we become one with His creation in a great and powerful anthem of praise. As we enter this season of thanksgiving, may we come to worship with this in mind: "Let everything that has breath praise the Lord!!"
