# Notes from Larry McCord, Minister of Music "Mindset"



If then you were raised with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God. Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth.

Colossians 3: 1-2

Sunday, April 7, will mark 5 years of service for William Muentes as the service pianist and accompanist at FUMC Red Oak. I will always remember his first month, as he came in on the first Sunday in April, then played our Easter music with us with just a few weeks of rehearsal. In the ensuing years, we have learned that William is not only an accomplished pianist but a very fine vocal soloist, a budding choral conductor and, of course, a master of sound technology. His expertise in the sound area proved especially important as we went through COVID and have experienced personnel changes in that area, though having him more focused in the keyboard area since Anthony is once again at the board has been a blessing for me. I know you will want to join me in celebrating his 5 years of service this month!

As we think of our lives after the resurrection, we are reminded in the scripture above that we have not only died with Christ but have risen with Him. Many times throughout his epistles, Paul speaks of the importance of setting our minds on Christ, on the spiritual rather than the carnal. This is especially important as we come to worship. Our minds are certainly "prone to wander," but our worship is designed to help us "set our minds" on God. We intentionally have many different worship activities to aid those in worship in connecting with God's Spirit.

Sit quietly during William's prelude and allow the beautiful melodies or rich harmonies to connect with your soul and lift your mind to a higher place. As the worship assistant pours the water, allow the words of the liturgy to become real: "Let the sound of the water nurture within you an awareness of God's presence." Whether you relate best to traditional hymns or contemporary praise choruses, sing with abandon, meditating on the meaning of the words. The words of the Call to Worship or the text read by Pastor Kevin may serve as yet another avenue through which God's Spirit connects with your inmost being. Whichever you find most meaningful or helpful, use that worship activity to still your mind and focus on the spiritual. And remember the promise from Isaiah, "Thou wilt keep Him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on thee, because he trusteth in thee."
