Notes from Larry McCord, Minister of Music





Fruit of the Spirit

"Now the works of the flesh are manifest which are these.... But the fruit of the Spirit is... Galatians 5: 19-23

As we enter the month of June, which begins with Pentecost Sunday followed immediately by Trinity Sunday, we will read many scripture passages related to the Spirit of God as part of our lectionary readings. The passage referenced above from Paul's letter to the Galatians is central to our understanding of the Holy Spirit's role in our Christian walk.

Paul wrote to the Christians at Galatia, many of whom were Gentile, to correct the teachings of certain individuals who were trying to deprive these new Christians of their freedom in Christ by insisting that they must follow the Jewish law to be saved. I understand "saved" here to refer not to rebirth but "the saving of the soul" or "sanctification." In contrasting the effect of living in the flesh or the Spirit, notice that Paul chooses the phrases "works of the flesh" and "fruit of the Spirit." Catering to the flesh is, ultimately, more difficult and taxing on our souls; in Peter's words, the desires of the flesh "war against the soul." While we tend to associate the flesh with overt, sinful acts such as drunkenness, fornication, stealing or violence, walking or living in the flesh is, in simple terms, relying on our own understanding and strength. We seek fulfillment of our desires in our own time and way, though many can never truly be satisfied. We pull ourselves up by our own bootstraps, thinking everything depends on us and forgetting that our heavenly Father knows what we need before we ask. Living in this way, rather than with faith and patience, injures, stresses and ultimately destroys our souls.

Living in the Spirit, however, is an entirely different approach to life. Notice that the term Paul uses is "fruit.". Unlike works, fruit is a naturally occurring result of a plant that is placed in the right environment, nourished, watered and otherwise nurtured for the best result. And, as Jesus reminds us, our heavenly Father is the husbandman who tends the vine, pruning as needed for ultimate growth. I do not mean to imply that walking in the Spirit means that we do not struggle or put in effort where our Christian life is concerned. Our state of mind as we encounter the challenges and needs of life, however, becomes different as we learn to trust in our Father to provide all we need from the beginning of our journey to the end. As Jesus promised, when we take His yoke upon us and learn of Him, we find rest for our souls even in the midst of life's turbulence.

The fruit of the Spirit is just that, not something we work up or pray down but the natural result of God's presence in our lives, nurtured through study, fellowship, meditation and prayer. As we begin to see our Father more clearly, we are "changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord."



PENTECOST: What is it? Why is it important in the Christian Church?

The Christian holy day of Pentecost, which is celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter, commemorates the descent and gift of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles. It is celebrated on the Sunday 50 days after Easter (the name comes from the Greek pentekoste, "fiftieth").

This coming **Sunday**, **June 5**th, Christians across the world will celebrate Pentecost. Pentecost is not as well-known as Christmas and Easter, although it commemorates a watershed event in Christian history. Before the events of the first Pentecost, which came a few weeks after Jesus' death and resurrection, there were followers of Jesus, but no movement that could be meaningfully called "the church." Thus, from an historical point of view, Pentecost is the day on which the church was started. This is also true from a spiritual perspective, since the Spirit brings the church into existence and enlivens it. Thus **Pentecost is the church's birthday**.

Christians did not invent the phrase "fiftieth day." Rather, they borrowed it from Greekspeaking Jews who used the phrase to refer to a Jewish holiday. This holiday was known as the Festival of Weeks, or, more simply, Weeks (*Shavuot* in Hebrew). This name comes from an expression in Leviticus 23:16, which instructs people to count seven weeks or "fifty days" from the end of Passover to the beginning of the next holiday.

The Pentecost event is recorded in the New Testament book, *The Acts of the Apostles*. Chapter 2 begins, "And when the day of Pentecost had come, they [the first followers of Jesus] were all together in one place" (2:1). All of a sudden, a sound came from heaven, like a strong wind, filling the house where the people had gathered. Something like tongues of fire rested on their heads. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages as the Spirit gave them the ability to speak" (2:4). The languages spoken by the early Christians were intelligible (not other worldly) and were heard by thousands of Jewish pilgrims who had come to Jerusalem to celebrate *Shavuot*. The content of the miraculous messages had to do with God's mighty works (2:11). Many who heard these messages in their own languages were amazed, though others thought the Christians were just drunk (2:12).

At one point, Peter, the apostle, stood up and preached his first sermon. He interpreted the events of that morning in light of a prophecy of the Hebrew prophet Joel. In that text, God promised to pour out his Spirit on all flesh, empowering diverse people to exercise divine power. This would be a sign of the coming "day of the Lord" (Acts 2:16-21; Joel 2:28-32).

Peter went on to explain that Jesus had been raised and had poured out the Spirit in fulfillment of God's promise through Joel (2:32-33). When the crowd asked what they should do, Peter urged them to turn their lives around and be baptized in the name of Jesus. Then they would be forgiven and would receive the gift of the Holy Spirit (2:37-39). Acts reports that about 3,000 people were added to the church that day (2:41). Not a bad response to Peter's first sermon!

Let's rejoice and celebrate together the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the church this Sunday!

Early Response Team (ERT) Training Class, June 11

An ERT training class will be held at Salado UMC on Saturday, June 11, from 9:00 AM – 5:00 PM. This 8-hour training is to become an Early Response Team member of the Central Texas Conference. One of the primary

ways the Central Texas Conference responds to disasters is via the Early Response Team (ERT). Our CTC ERTs respond to disasters within the conference, as well as helping other areas facing disasters.

The mission of an Early Response Team is to provide a caring presence in the aftermath of a disaster, under very specific guidelines that enables a team to be productive and caring while causing no further harm or being a burden to the affected community.

(Early Response Team training continued)

If you are called to serve as a member of the CTC ERT, you must_register and participate in one of the trainings taught throughout the year. These trainings are taught by "authorized" UMCOR trainers, and team members are given authorized ERT ID badges from UMCOR as evidence of completing the training. The topics covered in the class include the who, what, when, where and how of doing disaster response ministry, as well as some hands on experience in the specific tasks that Early Responders are expected to accomplish in the face of a disaster.

Persons completing this training will be issued a badge indicating they are approved to respond by the Central Texas Conference and UMCOR for a period of three (3) years.
