#### Remembering 9/11

OUR HELP - PAST, PRESENT, FUTURE

Once again this month, America marks the anniversary of the 9/11 terrorist attacks, which ended almost 3,000 lives and changed life forever for millions more. The nation was shaken to its very roots, with violence jolting out of us any assumption that "it can't happen here."

September 11 banished any lingering notion that being on the side of "liberty and justice for all" served as insulation against mass tragedy. We now had more to fear than fear itself.

We are never alone or without hope, even on life-altering days. How have God's presence and power sustained you through life's changes? #### **Notes from Larry McCord, Minister of Music**

#### The Importance of the Choir in Worship

...it came to pass, when the trumpeters and singers *were* as one, to make one sound to be heard in praising and thanking the LORD....that the house, the house of the LORD, was filled with a cloud, so that the priests could not continue ministering because of the cloud; for the glory of the LORD filled the house of God.

II Chronicles 5: 13-14

Today I read an interview with internationally-renowned Christian composer, conductor and performer Mark Hayes, whose music our choir and pianists have performed many times over the years. As part of the interview, Mr. Hayes was asked what he would say to churches/choir directors who were considering following the trend of many churches today no longer using a choir in worship. I include his full answer, unedited, below:

"Choirs are like mini bodies of Christ. They provide a sense of community and support unlike anything else in the church. They cause all singers to work together toward the common goal of praising God through music. Choirs provide a place where an "average" voice is valued and needed to achieve musical excellence. When people in the congregation see the choir perform, they are more likely to identify with a choir member than a sensational soloist or polished praise team singer. If our goal is to encourage the congregation to join in worship, what the choir models on the platform shows that every voice is valued. I would also encourage choir directors to be flexible in the repertoire they program. Sometimes the contemporary vs. traditional argument is more about one's personal tastes than it is about what is best for the worship experience."

I could not agree more and will not add or attempt to interpret what Mr. Hayes has said. I will, however, place his statement in the context of our local congregation.

Over the years I have served as your Minister of Music, I have become keenly aware that the chancel choir of FUMC Red Oak is a functioning body of Christ within the larger body of the congregation. The members of our choir pray for each other and follow up with calls, texts and visits to ensure that the needs of their fellow members are

being met. Not only in times of need, but even more in those time of rejoicing, when prayers have been answered or good things have taken place in one another's lives, they share one another's victories and successes. And William and I are not left out of this caring culture but are regularly asked how we are and what we need. While we are fortunate to have some members with musical training, even beyond high school and college, the majority of our choir is made up of what Mr. Hayes refers to as "average" voices who just want to sing and are faithful in their rehearsal and ministry commitments. We certainly fulfill the last portion of Mr. Hayes' statement, performing a variety of musical styles to hopefully engage as many in the congregation as possible but mainly just because we enjoy doing so.

I have passed a milestone in the history of my work in church music ministry. I have been at FUMC Red Oak longer than any of my previous church positions. Since I came in 2014, I have worked with 5 pastors, 3 youth directors (counting our newest, Anthony), 2 praise band leaders and a handful of administrative assistants. Only Judy is still in the position she held when I was hired. The one constant, other than my wonderful "right hand" Ms. Jo, has been the members of the choir who have treated me as a member of their family and done so much to support, encourage, comfort and share in my joys over the years. I will always remember how thankful I was to be with my church family the night of my first Christmas Eve service in 2014 when I received the news between services that the closest of my siblings, my older brother, had passed away. Pastor Allen came into rehearsal, stopped the choir and led the choir in prayer for me, knowing what a burden I was carrying. When I shared about how meaningful and helpful this was at my first "Epiphany Party" with the choir a few weeks later, I remember Keven Davis, who has also left us now, placing his hand on my shoulder to reassure me. And this is only one example.

As I begin my 10<sup>th</sup> year of ministry at FUMCRO, I look forward to all that God has in store for us in every aspect of worship and service. And I especially look forward to the many God will lead to join our choir and other music ministries as we fulfill the calling God has placed on our lives.



Our Chancel Choir has resumed rehearsals and will meet at 7:00 PM on Wednesday, September 6<sup>th</sup>. Choir rehearsals will begin meeting at 7:15 PM on September 13<sup>th</sup>. As we begin our preparations to minister through music this fall and into the Advent/Christmas season, I encourage each of you in our congregation to prayerfully consider joining us in this ministry. No musical background or experience is necessary, and you will be welcomed, supported and have great fun with this group. Come on out!!


#### **Acts of Kindness Coins**

#### Children's and Youth Sunday School Classes

Children's Sunday School classes of all ages continue to meet on Sunday mornings. Ms. Judy teaches  $PreK - 2^{nd}$  Grade and Ms. Geneise teaches  $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$  Grade. Ms. Mary Young will begin a new class for  $6^{th} - 8^{th}$  graders on Sunday, September  $10^{th}$ . A Youth Class for Grades 9 - 12 will also begin Sunday, September  $10^{th}$  with Anthony McKnight as the teacher. Class begins at 9:45 AM and ends at 10:30 AM. It is so important that the children listen to Bible stories and are taught that they, too, can be disciples of Jesus. Bring your children...we are ready to welcome them!

#### **ENRICHMENT CLASS**

The Enrichment Class continues its study- "He Gets Us: Experiencing the Confounding Love, Forgiveness, and Relevance of Jesus" by Max Lucado.

Jesus understands our lives because he was human too. He faced the same hardships and personal struggles that we encounter on a daily basis. He felt our deepest sadness and experienced our darkest solitude. Above all, Jesus gets us.

In Jesus' time, communities were deeply divided by bitter differences in religious beliefs, political positions, income inequality, legal status, and ethnic differences. But where was Jesus in all of this? Did he align with the religious elites? Or did he start an uprising to overthrow them? Neither of the above.

Instead, he went from town to town, offering hope, new life, and modeling a different way to live and to change the world. # A Mission and Community Outreach Opportunity at Red Oak Rehabilitation Center

#### **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!**

Red Oak Rehab Activities Director, Julie Gaitan, reached out to FUMCRO for help with programing for patients. One of her requests was for **Bible lessons**, **hymns**, **and communion**. Pastor Kevin will start a pilot program to also offer communion.

There are 140 residents in Rehab: 24 are in Memory Care, and about 48 in the main nursing home that are bed fast. Communion will be delivered to these residents after the elements are blessed. Those that are ambulatory will come to the dining area and will be served there. We need some man/ woman power,



please.

Tuesday afternoons are usually Bingo afternoons with either Julie or her assistant calling the numbers, and we are there to assist the residents with their cards. Many are not able to identify the numbers, so you get to play about 8 or 9 cards as you stroll around the tables to be sure numbers are

covered. The patients are so thrilled when they win!!!! It is 2 hours well spent in helping others have a bit of happiness. We have taken treats -- ice cream and fried pies -- and small prizes for bingo - lotion is very well received, as are puzzle books.

Outreach, Hospitality and Missions Committee is heading up this outreach program and is asking the congregation for help in the following ways/times:

- 1) Your time for communion (date & time TBD)
- 2) Your time for either Tuesday morning (10:00 -12:00) or afternoon (2:00-4:00). 2 people are needed for each shift.
- 3) Your time, as you have it, to spend visiting, praying or reading to bedfast residents. These people often only see the nurse or aides. Family visits are rare. Residents are lonely. A list will be at the front desk of the Rehab center with names and room numbers. Please leave your name by the name(s) of the resident(s) you see. We need to visit as many of these folks as we can, please.
- 4) Craft supplies all kinds clean out your hobby closet. There will be a collection basket in the foyer of the church.
- 5) Bingo prizes Dollar Tree price range. They love cookies and candy and coloring books and colored pencils or crayons.
- 6) Nail polish of all colors, polish remover and wipes, finger nail files and clippers for Julie and her assistant to use on residents
- 7) Your old magazines can be placed in the same basket
- 8) Money to buy treats and/or prizes for Tuesdays. Checks can be made to FUMCRO with RO Rehab in the memo line

OHM is hoping you can respond in some way to these needs. Please pray over your help with this outreach mission; I hope the Holy Spirit sends you to me to schedule a time or to ask a question.
