I tuned in last night on the Zoom call to receive information on the Central Texas Conference Policy on the Process of Dis-Affiliation from the United Methodist Church. Over 300 people were on that call, and the majority were laity. There is a great deal of anxiety in our CTC churches. You may find it shocking that pastors and churches in the CTC are considering leaving the United Methodist Church. **WHY?** 

Let me be clear. I am not suggesting our church should dis-affiliate. A great deal of prayer and gracious conversation will precede any thought at all of arriving at any decision on this issue. This division in the UMC is decades in the making. The presenting issue is the profound conflict over the UMC position on homosexuality.

"We affirm that sexuality is God's good gift to all persons ... Although all persons are sexual beings whether or not they are married, sexual relations are affirmed only with the covenant of monogamous, heterosexual marriage ... we affirm that all persons are individuals of sacred worth, created in the image of God. All persons need the ministry of the Church in their struggles of human fulfillment ... the United Methodist Church does not condone the practice of homosexuality and considers this practice incompatible with Christian teaching. We affirm that God's grace is available to all." (2016 Book of Discipline, paragraph 161G)

This position is unchanged since 1972. Numerous General Conference sessions have failed to amend it. *This is not the only issue dividing our denomination*. United Methodists have had widely divergent views on the role of Scripture, our connectional system, and other issues. This column touches only the tip of the iceberg. When the scheduled General Conference of 2022 was delayed to 2024, due to Covid-19 concerns, that was the last straw for many United Methodists and churches who feel we are at the breaking point.

At our next meeting of Administrative Council, this issue will be mentioned. However, many conversations and times of prayer will occur before any decisions are made.

## Notes from Larry McCord, Minister of Music Prepare Our Hearts





[N]ow have I seen with joy thy people, which are present here, to offer willingly unto thee. O Lord God of Abraham, Isaac, and of Israel, our fathers, keep this for ever in the imagination of the thoughts of the heart of thy people, and prepare their heart unto thee....

I Chronicles 29:17-18

In the closing chapters of I Chronicles, we have what are known as "The Last Words of David," in which King David addresses the people of Israel including his son Solomon who is to succeed him on the throne. The opening words of this section are the basis of a beautiful anthem by Randall Thompson, which I hope to have our choir share in worship some day.

In the passage above, however, David asks God for something that we see mentioned numerous times in both books of Chronicles and other Old Testament scriptures, "prepare your heart to seek (or serve or give to) the Lord." When the deeds of the various kings are mentioned, they are said to have "prepared [their] hearts to seek the Lord" or not to have done so, which generally did not end well for either the king or the people. Likewise, when Israel is called to repentance or to a day of special prayer and fasting, they are always instructed to prepare their hearts.

As with so much in the Christian life, the question is "But how?" What is even meant by preparing our hearts? A place to begin is meditating on these scriptures:

Psalm 10:17 LORD, thou hast heard the desire of the humble: thou wilt prepare their heart....

Philippians 2:13 For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of his good pleasure.

Romans 8:26 Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought....

Proverbs 16:1 The preparations of the heart in man, and the answer of the tongue, is from the LORD.

God calls us to prepare our hearts. As we listen and respond, we hear His still small voice pointing out the need for repentance in some aspect of our life, reminding us of a scripture upon which we need to meditate, directing us to pray for a particular situation or person. These are just a few examples. The point is to begin and trust God step-by-step along the way.

I challenge us all to begin a practice of meditation and prayer before we come to worship or other gatherings each week. When we come prepared, God is able to do even more in our midst and surprise us with His goodness, leading us to even deeper worship.






