Our FPC Mission Ministry is pleased to announce that a grant of \$2,000 has been received from Presbytery of New Covenant for our ministry at Freedom Place, a ministry of Arrow Child & Family Ministries, near Spring, Texas. Freedom Place is a Christcentered care and residential treatment center for underage female victims of domestic child sex-trafficking, ages 12 to 18. The program includes medical care, substance abuse treatment, psychiatric evaluation and trauma counseling, on-site accredited high school education, daily living skills, spiritual needs, equestrian and dog therapy, and reunification with family or relatives when that is possible. Grant funds will go to sports equipment, swimming pool maintenance, grooming tools for the equine therapy program, art materials, reimbursement of volunteer expenses, and instruction and leadership for these activities.
