Our Corona Virus (COVID- 19) Response

The Coronavirus (COVID-19) has become a global health issue and Partnership With Native Americans (PWNA) is actively monitoring the situation, keeping health and safety close to our hearts, and working closely with you, our partners, to understand how to best address your needs during this time. We are being especially mindful of those most vulnerable – the Elders.

We know that tribal areas are especially at risk. PWNA is still processing orders and we want to remind you to submit your reports and requests on time. We have plenty of hand soap in stock and limited supplies of sanitizer, toilet paper and paper towels. If you are expecting a shipment from PWNA, please let us know as soon as possible whether you will be available to accept it. If your program shuts down, we will hold your products until your program resumes operation.

Please contact PWNA if circumstances beyond your control happen, such as:

- Your event is cancelled/postponed – we'll adjust your report due date
- Your community is not allowing deliveries
- You are quarantined and cannot accept deliveries

PWNA will contact you ASAP if:

- Our office is quarantined for any length of time
- A driver is feeling ill and your delivery must be postponed
- We need to meet in a special location to mitigate health risk

Please reach out to PWNA at any time with concerns or questions. Stay safe, stay home if you are feeling ill and wash your hands to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 in your community. And stay up to date by visiting

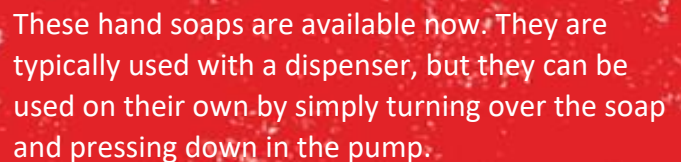

School Supplies Deadline: May 1

Pre-K to 12 schools and Head Starts are eligible to submit a request for school supplies. PWNA provides a variety of items for every child in the school. This may include notebooks, rulers, pencils, glue, crayons and other supplies. We ask that program partners distribute supplies during back-to-school events or student registration/orientation.
