LONG-TERM SOLUTIONS UPDATE

4D LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

It was a busy year for 4D in 2023, we had 13 individuals from Zuni, Hopi, Navajo, White Mountain Apache and Yavapai Apache Nation successfully graduate from the 6-month leadership program focused on professional and

personal development. Each individual was paired with a Native professional key/mentor for the cohort to assist, ensure accountability, and provide resources to help participants meet their self-determined goals. Additionally, in working with the San Carlos Apache Tribe to provide the needed emergency preparedness trainings and leadership skills, we graduated a cohort of 13 individuals who received training in 1st Aid & CPR, CERT training, Active Shooter, Self-Defense & Self-Awareness, Family Emergency & 72-hour Kit planning, team building, goal setting and learning about their strengths, self-care and lateral violence. Lastly, we had two 4D alumni events for the adults and youth. It was a great time for reunited support, additional learning of self-worth, health and wellness, and overall community building. We're glad to be a part of their individual journeys to become successful advocate for their communities!

This program came at the right time for me as I changed positions with my job and was the best decision I made professionally. I was able to build connections as I am an introverted person, but I found that it was easy to be myself, and I made relationships. Second, I was able to restore my confidence – this program helped push me out there. Shout out to my mentor Denisa! I have read and knew about the junk food tax on the Navajo Nation and the recognition it has made; to hear and see that my mentor was the main player was more validation that I am at the right place at the right time.

INDIGENOUS RECIPE WILD RICE AND LAMB STEW

Recipe property of Chef Denella (used here with permission)



INGREDIENTS

- 1lb mutton, diced
- · 2 onions, diced
- 3 celery stalks, diced
- · 2 carrots, diced
- · 4 potatoes, cubed
- 112-oz can tomato paste
- 2 cups wild rice
- 6 cups water
- 3 tbsp Paprika
- 2 tbsp onion powder
- 2 tbsp garlic powder
- 3 tbsp black pepper

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Sear the lamb, onions, celery, and carrots for 10 minutes.
- 2. Add all the spices and tomato paste, cook about 2 minutes, then add potatoes.
- 3. Pour the water into the pot and boil for 45 minutes.
- 4. Add your wild rice and boil for an additional 35 to 45 minutes. (Wild rice blooms when it's cooked.)

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

SERVICE HIGHLIGHT SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Did you know PWNA offers a School Supplies service to eligible schools and Head Starts that serve Pre-K through 12th grade students located on or near reservations we serve? The supplies can help students be better prepared for homework and the classroom. They also save the schools/teachers/families funds they can use for another purpose. The School Supplies service consists of the following age-appropriate components:

- Head Start: Supplies such as jumbo crayons, paper, and folder
- Elementary School: Supplies such as wide-ruled paper, pencils, and a ruler
- Middle/High School: Supplies such as 3-ring binders, pens, and calculators

The School Supplies service is offered once a year; requests are taken beginning in January. The last day to submit a request is May 1st. Once received, it will be reviewed, and the partner will be notified whether the request was approved or declined. Once approved, accurate and complete reporting is essential to participate in the School Supplies service. The report and distribution log(s) are due within 30 days after your delivery date.
